

#### 'AL conspiring to hold elections unilaterally to cling to power'



He explained that the government is supposed to ratify such a treaty and then place it before the parliament. "Since the CTBT has been ratified by the government, it has to be laid before the Parliament," the Speaker said. "We never ratified any such treaty in parliament." Article 145A reads, "All treaties with foreign countries

shall be submitted to the President, who shall cause them to be laid before Parliament: Provided that any such treaty connected with national security shall be laid in a secret




