# Sharif's lawyers boycott trial

## Court gives one day to contact defence team

KARACHI, Mar 13: An antiterrorist court gave deposed prime minister Nawaz Sharif one day to contact his defence team, all of whom boycotted the trial today to press their demand that the case be moved out of southern Karachi, where their colleague was slain last week, reports AP.

Judge Rehmetullah Hussein Jaffri adjourned the hearing until tomorrow after Sharif told the court he had not spoken to his lawyers and only read of their decision to boycott his

trial in the newspapers.
"I read about the decision of my lawyers not to come to court in the newspaper," Sharif told the court. "I haven't had any contact with them and their decision has not been taken with my knowledge. We should be provided the facilities to contact our lawyers and find out what is in their minds."

The judge agreed and ordered the prosecution to let Sharif telephone his lawyers, most of whom live in the eastern Pun-

jab capital of Lahore. On Sunday Sharif's lawyer, Khawaja Sultan, told The Associated Press that the defense team will refuse to participate in the trial if it is held in Karachi, where last Friday one of the leading defense lawyers, Iqbal Radh, was shot and

Radh was gunned down by three men who stormed his second story law office in the heart

No evidence has surfaced that links the shooting to the Sharif hijacking trial. However, Sharif's remaining de- and prosecution still remainlense lawyers say they lear for ling their lives and Sultan said "We won't come to Karachi." The judge refused to consider a change of venue for the trial,

at least not until after Sharif contacted his lawyers.

Sharif, his younger brother, Shahbaz, and five other close aides have been imprisoned since a military coup last Oct. 12 toppled his elected govern-ment. They are on trial on hijacking, treason, kidnapping and attempted murder charges. On the day of the coup.

Sharif allegedly refused to let a passenger plane carrying army chief Gen. Pervez Musharraf land in Karachi. The plane eventually landed, but with just seven minutes of fuel left.

Sharif has pleaded not guilty. His trial is nearing its conclusion with final arguments from both the defense


