Strike cripples Indian state of Tripura

AGARTALA, India, Apr 17 India's northeastern state of Tripura came to a near standstill today as a strike called to protest against the massacre of 12 people took hold, reports Reuters.

Government offices, businesses, shops, schools and colleges were shut because of the 24-hour strike called by political parties including the state's ruling Communist Party of India (Marxist) to press for federal

Europe's immigrant influx rankles some, but others see salvation

ROME, Apr 17: The new Eu- full. ropeans stake their turf where they step off the train: The blocks around Rome's rail station bustle with Chinese hawking the latest in plastic goods, video stores wallpapered with veiled Punjab poster beauties, Senegalese shivering over counters of withering tropical fruit-in-exile, reports AP.

East Asians dominate the immigrant enclave but not yet in such numbers it can properly be called a Chinatown. It's a China-Philippines-India-Nigeria-Morocco-Bangladesh Town, heterogeneous nationalities huddling together in homogenous Rome.


