BERLIN, March 21: The Stasi, former East Germany's secret police, deployed some 50 ents to spy on a former Dynamo Berlin star who emigrated to the West, German television revealed Monday, re-

ports AFP. Lutz Eigendorf, a former East German international, and his family were kept under strict surveillance after fleeing the communist state in 1979 according to ARD television. who are to screen a programme on the Stasi and how they hounded dissidents on whom they kept thick dossiers.

Eigendorf died in a car accident in 1983 in suspicious circumstances four years after using a friendly match in the West against Kaiserslautern to cross the Iron Curtain and claim political asylum.

Kaiserslautern promptly signed him up to the fury of Stasi boss and Dynamo president Erich Mielke, who allegedly ordered the player be 'e-

liminated.' "Eigendorf was a privileged individual in the socialist regime. When he turned his back on the East German state that constituted a slap in the face for Mielke," said ARD producer Heribert Schwan.

According to Stasi documents an unnamed individual was hired to provoke a road accident by ramming Eigendorf's car. However, alcohol was given as the official cause of death with a level of 2.2 grams of alcohol in his blood sample.

Doctors say that would imply the player had drunk 4.3 litres of beer. Witness accounts say Eigendorf drank four or five beers on the night in question.
