ronment in the region. River training and diversion of its course for constructing a bridge over the river Padma will in fact damage crop lands and enhance further erosion leading to sharp fall in water flow on the eastern zone during the dry season. Besides, saline water from the sea will enter into parts of Chandpur and Shariatpur to destroy vast resources there, he said in the let-

Prof Bepari pointed out that a tunnel under the river Padma would greatly reduce the distance between Dhaka and the 22 south-western districts and ease movement of vehicular traffic along with establishment of gas and train lines between the two sides. This will also help Dhaka city expand southward with reduction in air pollution, he observed.


FF's grand rally Apr 22






