

"We have certainly heard the news and like everyone else we're shocked." ACB public affairs general manager Brendan McClements said.

"It poses no threat to the (Australian one-day) series in South Africa.

"And we're confident the ICC (International Cricket Council) and the United Cricket Board of South Africa will deal with these matters effectively and expeditiously.'


