# River erosion apprehended along 15 Sylhet border villages

**Protect 15 riverside border villages**

SYLHET, Apr 17: Unabated collection of stones from quarries alongside the two flood control embankments in Gowainghat thanas might cause a serious river bank erosion in the areas.

Initiatives by the local administration, Water Development Board (WDB) officials, BDR personnel, even by the local MP yielded no effective result. None could stop unscrupulous people from doing such irregularities.

Official sources informed The Daily Star that with a view to protecting the areas from recurring floods and erosion, WDB had constructed about 27,000 metres long embankment on both sides of the Pina river from Gowainghat to Ballaghat at an expenditure of Taka 80 lakh in 1981. But some organised gangs, with the help of poor labourers of the locality, were collecting stones from the quarries under the very nose of administration, endangering the embankments.

Alarmingly the lands in Bangladesh territory were disappearing into the rivers which were running alongside the borders. A vast tract of land had already gone under the grip of the Indian territory.

A number of people living in the areas said that Sangram Punji, a locality of Khasia tribes and some other villages including a tea garden might go into the gorge of the river at any time.

The WDB officials said that a number of general category (GDs) were registered with the local police station. Several times the matter was discussed with BDR, but the initiatives yielded no result. BDR men posted at the nearby border outposts demarcated some areas and clamped some temporary bamboo posts for protecting the areas. But these also could not be strictly maintained, local people alleged. The law enforcing people also expressed their inability to catch the floating people, most of whom were involved with the practice.

Some experts said that the river was widening day by day due to indiscriminate lifting of stones and earth. It might cause devastation in 10 to 15 villages. Stones from over 200 metres area of Dauki's right side embankment were already being lifted away, threatening the nearby villages.

Immediate steps should be taken to protect the vast river banks as well as the adjacent areas located in the important border region.

Another UNB report says: Despite having alternative sources, earth is illegally being collected from small hills for the reconstruction works of Sylhet-Tamabil road causing extensive damage to forest resources.

Locals alleged that the concerned construction companies are collecting huge earth from hillocks at Darboster, Bichnatek, Tengra, Noakhel, Hemu, Sampur, Fatehpur, Daiki, Tupipahar, Jaflong and Naljuri through middlemen.

These middlemen are influencing the small hill owners and in some cases are forcing them to sell earth from their hillocks, giving the area a deserted look.

As per the country's existing law, one needs permission from the government for cutting any small hill, a rule is hardly seen to be practised.

When contacted officials of the construction companies said there is no need to take permission as the soil is being used for the development of the country.

But the locals said the contractors have scopes to collect earth from alternatives sources as there is a good number of canals, beels and small rivers alongside the road which are being silted up.

The main rivers and canals of the region include Sari, Kapna, Piyain, Lain Purakhai, Borogang, Damri and Hemu, and they have several tributaries too.

## Problem in land survey work in Moulvi Bazar

MOULVI BAZAR, Apr 17: Land owners of Moulvi Bazar Sadar Upozila have been suffering a lot due to absence of Assistant Commissioner of Land as land survey is going on in different villages.

It is learnt that AC (Land) of the upozila was transferred to Sylhet district a few months back. A new AC (Land) was appointed, but within a few days he was also transferred due to unknown reason. Since then the post of AC (Land) has been lying vacant.

Land survey workers are allegedly disturbing the land owners. In some cases, the survey workers refused to record the land even after showing proper documents. In some cases the workers are also recording the land with fake documents, it is widely alleged.

In such a situation, the suffering people go to the AC (Land) office to solve their documentary problems of land. But due to absence of AC (Land), employees of the office fail to serve them. Grabbing this opportunity unscrupulous people with the help of Land Survey workers have been recording the land according to their whim. As a result genuine land owners have been falling in traps. In some cases collision is being occurred on the issue of land recorded by the land survey employees.

Sadar Upozila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) is now looking after the office of AC (Land). As UNO is a busy administration of the upozila, he has little scope to give sufficient time for AC

(Land) matters. On the other hand, it is Moulvi Bazar Sadar Upozila, AC (Land) office is about four kilometres away from the Upozila Nirbahi Officer's office. So it is very difficult for him to look after two offices in two separate places.

People of Sadar Upozila have demanded immediate appointment of AC (Land) here for their greater interest.

### Power link extension sought

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Apr 17: Irrigation facilities through electrification can bring about 20,000 acres of the district, especially in Nawabganj, Nachol, Gomastapur and Bholahat thanas under cultivation during the winter season, reports BSS.

At present, only 10,000 acres are being cultivated with water supplied power pumps from the River Mohananda and from other beels and ponds. It may be mentioned here that for lack of electricity driven machine, thousands of acres cannot be properly cultivated. The lands abandoned for 1000 acres may be brought under IRRI and Boro cultivation at a very low cost if electricity connection is extended to these areas.

### Shortage of doctors

PATUAKHALI, Apr 17: Lack of doctors and inadequate medicine supply to hospitals have brought the healthcare system to its knees, reports UNB.

According to competent sources, there is one doctor for 50,000 people and 62 posts of doctor, out of 89, in government hospitals have long been lying vacant. They said their repeated appeals to appoint doctors to 18 vacant posts, out of 27, in General Hospital here fell in the deaf ears. Of the vacant post, one is of senior consultant (pediatric), one of junior consultant, one of anesthetic, 10 of medical officer and five of assistant registrar. The officials said 30 posts, out of 48, are lying vacant in Galachipa, Kalapara, Bauful, Dashmina, Mirzapur and Sadar thana health complexes. The 12 centres virtually have no doctors since their inception.

### Rally at Panchagarh

PANCHAGRAH, Apr 17: A rally was held in observance of National Disaster Preparedness Day under the auspices of District Disaster Arrangement Committee (DDAC) here recently, reports BSS.

It was jointly led by deputy commissioner Mohammad Robiul Islam and police super AB Barua of the district. The rally was followed by a discussion.

### Land tax realised

CHUADANGA, Apr 17: A total of Taka 29,52,317 Land Development Tax has been realised from the tenants of four thanas of Chuadanga district during the first seven months of the current financial year, till January 2000, reports BSS.

According to an official source, of the total amount Taka 12,06,183 have been realised from Chuadanga Sadar thana, Taka 7,36,359 from Alamdanga thana, Taka 6,43,361 from Damurhuda thana and Taka 3,66,414 from Jibanagar thana. The government has fixed up a target to realise Taka 81,50,411 Land Development Tax from the tenants of the four thanas during the current financial year.

### Law and order discussed

SHERPUR, Apr 17: The members of Sherpur district branch of Bangladesh Human Rights Commission met Police Super Mesbahun Nabi and exchanged views on law and order in Sherpur, recently. The meeting lasted for about an hour, reports BSS.

The dead was injured by a truck driver after the combing operation, but expressed concern over non-recovery of arms. District President of the Human Rights Commission M Abdur Rahman Lilo, veteran politician Robi Niojee, Secretary Advocate Pradip Dev Krishna, Laily Begum and Abdul Hakim Bablu were present in the exchange of views meeting.

### Workshop in Shariatpur

SHARIATPUR, Apr 17: A day-long workshop organised by Bangladesh Krishi Bank (BKB) concluded in the Zilla parishad auditorium here on April 5, reports BSS.

Officials of different BKB branches took part in the workshop.

### Boy killed in road mishap

SAVAR, Apr 17: Loosing control over the steering, driver of a truck drove his vehicle on a roadside shop here on April 10 killing a boy and injuring five people, reports UNB.

The dead was identified as Babu, 8 son of Mohammad Ali of the municipal area. The injured were admitted to Savar Thana Health Complex. Three of them were identified as Selim, 28, Makkul, 30, and Hasan, 28. Police said the accident occurred at Savar Bazaar Bus Stand at about 5pm. The truck was seized, but its driver and helpers managed to flee the scene. A case was filed in this connection.

### Indian fisherman convicted

BAGERHAT, Apr 17: A court here on April 6 sentenced an Indian fisherman to three months rigorous imprisonment (RI) for intruding into Bangladesh territory, reports UNB.

The convict was identified as Sheikh Muhammad Ali Hossain of village Kakdeep in Kashinagar thana of Chhabish Pargana, West Bengal. According to prosecution, police arrested Hossain along with a mechanised boat and some fishing nets from the River Daratana in Sadar thana on March 27 this year. He confessed to the police that he deliberately crossed the border for fishing in the river. After examining records and witnesses, the judge handed down the judgement.
