





Lewis, 32, says he had the unnamed players' identities revealed to him by sports promoter Ashim Kheterpal.

But the ECB have refused to launch an immediate investigation until they discover more of the facts.



"After we have studied the article in detail we will then decide what course of action to take, if any," said ECB media relations officer Andrew Walpole.
