When the order is ready, the waiter takes it to the Panda. The Panda eats the meal, pulls out a gun, shoots the waiter and runs out of the restaurant.

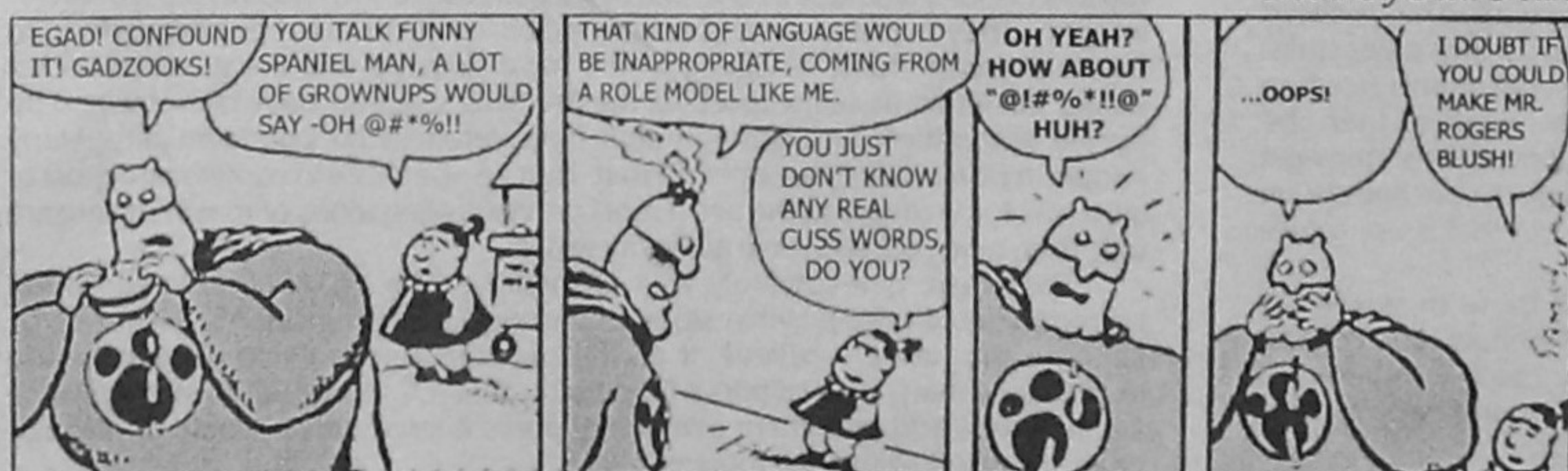
The owner of the restaurant goes running after the Panda. When the restaurant owner finally catches up to

Weird Science HUMMING DOG

Earlier this year, the mystified owners took Zoe to a vet, Ian Millar of Belfast. After various tests and a course of treatment with antibiotics in case an infection was responsible, Millar professed himself mystified as well. He wrote to The Veterinary Record asking if anyone could shed light on the problem. A couple of weeks later, Patrick Burke of the University of Edinburgh's Royal School of Veterinary Studies wrote back.

The problem, he suggested, was a phenomenon known as "otoacoustic emission". In this condition, the normal hearing pathways in the ears are somehow reversed, so that the cochlear efferent nerve fibres stimulate outer hair cells to vibrate and make a noise. Other parts of the ear such as the tympanic membrane can then amplify the sound, until you end up like Zoe, humming wherever you go.
