But when Manzoor submitted the certificate, CCDM refused to accept that saying it tary Jainal Abedin Liton. The CCDM, referring to a letter submitted by Victoria in the past, claimed that the certificate was invalid as they were asked by the club not to entertain any document signed by Liton.

However, Surjo Tarun did not take the CCDM decision sportingly. Talking to The Daily Star last night one Mamun of the club said that it was a conspiracy against them.

According to Mamun, the certificate was valid because Liton was the cricket secretary of that club last season.

TOKYO, Apr 23: Japan's Mai Nakamura set a women's world 50 metres long-course backstroke record of 28.67 seconds in a preliminary heat of the Japanese national championships today, reports Reuters.
