



Two-stroke engine vehicles

Govt prefers conversion to imposing ban

By Staff Correspondent

The government will encourage conversion of twostroke engine vehicles into CNG-run ones instead of a ban in the next budget, said Finance Minister S A M S. Kibria yesterday.

He also said the financial institutions should tag the condition of setting up a waste treatment plant before giving loans to any industrial project to curb the country's environmental degradation.

Kibria was speaking at a roundtable on "Eco-friendly Budget" where academics and NGO activists urged him to address the environmental issues in the next budget and take steps to check the onslaught on environmental.

CIH virus Computer systems in Bangladesh

partially affected The CIH virus partially affected computer systems in Bangladesh yesterday, reports

"We received more than 100

telephone calls informing that their computer systems were damaged by the virus," Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC) executive director Dr Abdus Sobhan said. He, however, said the num-

ber of affected PCs would not be so high as they think owners of all the damaged computers contacted them. "We also request others affected who didn't inform us about the matter.'

The BCC had opened a CIH help desk to make people aware about averting the invading virus attack by changing the date April 26. Dr Sobhan said there was no report to PC damage from any organisation of corporate house.

"We do believe the some 100 computers hit by the CIH or Chernobyl virus are of personal use. When our officials asked why they didn't take preparations, they said they simply ig-

nored the warnings. He said most of the reported CIH attacks were from capital Dhaka. "However, there were also report from several dis-

tricts, including Chittagong."

The CIH cyber menace had a massive attack on computer systems across the globe on April 26, last year. This time the damage was not so high following precautionary measures, in Bangladesh on TV, radio and newspapers.

The BCC requested all if anyone's computer was attacked by the virus to contact its help desk (phone 8614224/8613773) which will remain open till 10 pm today. It also requested the affected

PC users to contact their suppliers or repairing houses to restore operation of their computer systems at the earliest possible time.
