The Historic May Day will be observed in the country as elsewhere in the world today with a renewed pledge to protect rights of the working class and increase production in mills and factories, reports UNB.

On this day in 1886, four workers were killed in police firing in Chicago of America during a movement to establish eight-hour working day and rights of the workers.

The day is public holiday. President Shahabuddin Ahmed, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Leader of the Opposition Khaleda Zia gave separate messages on the occasion. Different organisations and Labour and Employment Min-
