Service Providers (ISPs). BRAC BDMail Ltd., which had temporarily solved the problem by setting a new domain address, has virtually gone down to its knees asking the hackers what they want in exchange of its domain

However, the unknown hackers have bluntly said its not money but "transparency, unity and quality service from the ISPs" that has driven them into the act

In an e-mail to all the ISPs, they said the domain will be returned if their conditions are met. The conditions are: BRAC BDMail shall have to acknowledge the fact that its domain was hacked and apologise to all their clients through an advertisement in the front page of ev-

All the ISPs must come to a deal on client services, security and defaulter-client management etc. "ISP Forum has not done anything except eating and gossiping in the name of meeting. Do something useful. Besides, why do you take Tk 5000 from each ISP for a meet-See page 11 col 8
