

The world's number oneranked batsman hit the headlines this week when finally agreeing to tour England this summer, after initially considering pulling out due to the illhealth of his mother.


But his own problems have also caused Lara to seek stress therapy and psychiatric consultation before returning to the international arena "It was not like I was stressed out or losing weight or letting
