

A new WASA water pump station started functioning yesterday at Bounia of Mirpur in the city, ending the logstanding water problem in the area, reports BSS.





Restrictions on public movement in cantt areas sparks debate in JS body

Lawmakers yesterday debated with the army chief and the Defence Secretary the restrictions on public movement in the cantonment areas and issuance of certificate to freedom fighters by the Muktijoddha Sangsad, reports UNB.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on defence took up the matters for discussion. Defence Secretary Idris Ali, present in the meeting at Sangsad Bhaban, reportedly challenged a recommendation of the Standing Committee taken in a previous meeting that the respective service headquarters would issue certificates to the members of the Armed Forces.

Idris Ali was learnt to have told the meeting that "the government is not bound to obey the decision of the standing committee. "His remark generated lot of heat among the members, and Chairman of the Committee KM Shafiullah reportedly also got annoyed.

Later the Defence Secretary agreed to process the issue but said the response may be nega-

Outspoken BNP lawmaker Maj (retd) Akhteruzzaman made a hard-hitting observation amid the hot talk: "The bureaucrats want to jeopardise the democratic system by undermining the authority and jurisdiction of the standing commit tees in particular and parliament as a whole."

He said when the Prime Minister herself is a member of the committee, it was presumed that decisions taken by it were equally agreed upon by her "And till date, she has never disagreed with various decisions taken by this committee, though she never attended any of the meetings."

The meeting also discussed the issue of restrictions in the entrance and use of cantonments by the civilians and again picked up a debate with Army Chief Lt Gen Mustafizur Rahman.
