

of certain insects, flies and pharings. The colour the paintings generate is a wonder in itself. At times, one may confuse between a water lily and a butterfly. And it is this that sets his paintings apart from that of his peers. He confuses people by bringing out the similarities between different things. Yet, there is a magical 'something' that allows one to decipher the depth. The joy is something like the satisfaction after being able to solve a puzzle!

Emotions play a big role in his paintings. He feels that just like humans, all other living things express sorrow, joy, pain, anger, happiness etc. It's just that the form of expression differs.

"In my paintings I depict the moods of man, nature and other elements both symbolically and suggestively," said the artist.

Very interesting are the paintings depicting birds. Birds and nature combines to give an image which speaks of freedom, of purity and grace. Be it birds on the sea shore, birds flying over the seas, or birds nibbling at stray branches, the bird theme has attracted a lot of attention.

The war of liberation is an ongoing inspiration for Showkatuzzaman. While he feels proud to be of the generation who made independence

Bahini. They had a great contribution in making Bangladesh a free land. He feels these women have a creativity of their own. They are of a different element altogether. 


