Mosharraf to be reappointed Petrobangla Chairman

By Staff Correspondent In an unprecedented move, the government has decided to reappoint Mosharraf Hossain as Chairman of Petrobangla for the fourth time on contract ba-

sis, sources concerned said. His contract service for the third time ended on April 13 this year. Since then Petrobangla is going without a

chairman. This time Mosharraf's contract service will be for one year and he is likely to take over as Petrobangla chairman shortly.

The sources said that reappointment of the former chairman would not remove the stalemate gripping Petrobangla. Besides, senior officials in the organisation aspiring for the post are feeling disappointed at this.

Following the expiry of Mosharraf's contract service in April, the Energy Ministry had proposed to appoint former Petrobangla director Sajedul Karim as Chairman. The Prime Minister's Office (PMO) rejected the proposal saying that the government preferred to appoint a senior engineer to the

President, PM hold closed-door talks

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina met President Shahabuddin Ahmed yesterday, generating a lot of speculations in political circles on the appointment of a new chief election commissioner.

The PM went to the Bangabhaban the day after the ruling Awami league Presidium advised her to unilaterally nominate a new CEC for appointment by the President.

The PM spent about an hour with the President from 12: 30 pm. But it could not be known immediately what was discussed. "It was a closed door meeting. Only the PM's Princi-

Meanwhile, a Bangabhaban press release yesterday said, "The Prime Minister apprised the President of some important issues of the state". It did not elaborate.

The meeting however generated various speculations in political quarters as the AL Presidium advised the PM and party chief on Friday 'to go ahead with the dictates of the Constitution as regards appointment of a new CEC'. The

Constitution permits the PM to unilaterally nominate a CEC for appointment by the President. The Presidium also authorised Hasina to nominate any one of her choice for the post of CEC, although some of its members suggested that the new CEC should be a retired bu-

"But the Prime Minister is not supposed to orally communicate to the President whom she wants to see as chief election commissioner," a ruling party leader said when asked about the purpose behind the PM's meeting with the Presi-

Political leaders and senior officials who were involved in the peace process will also attend the meeting.

Issues likely to be discussed included implementation of the CHT peace accord, law and order situation, land problem and land commission, rehabilitation of refugees and facilities for the former Shantibahini members.

The peace accord was signed on December 2, 1997, ending the decades old tribal insurgency in the region.

More rains, flood forecast

A moderate to severe flood is likely this year, meteorologists and experts said.

"There is a rising trend in the Southern Oscillator Index (SOI) in the Indian Ocean as in 1998 which may cause more rains than normal and flooding this monsoon", Space and Atmospheric scientist Dr AM Choudhury told The Daily Star vesterday. But it may not be as severe as

the 1998 flood when it stayed for four months, affecting most parts of the country, said Dr Choudhury who monitors weather at the Space and Atmospheric Research Organisation (SPAARSO). SOI indicator had been on




