
Before I Went To College I Wish I Had Known:



ORN in Israel only 19 years ago, Natalie Portman has already been compared to the great Hollywood legend, Audrey Hepburn. While sharing Hepburn's grace, intelligence, and demure beauty, Portman has won over critics and audiences with small but memorable parts in a variety of films in her short career.

She first came to prominence in Luc Besson's The Professional, in which she played a young girl who hires a hitman (Jean Reno) to avenge the death of her brother. Portman instantly won raves for her performance, as critics noted that this was a young actress far beyond her then 12 years of age; praise that she lived up to in her next role as Al Pacino's step-daughter in Heat.

Portman then moved away from the action film genre for her next three choices, all of which were supporting roles in large ensemble films. One of these, Mars Attacks!, Tim Burton's parody of Independence Day-style doomsday films, boasted a big cast, but was a major flop both financially and critically.

That same month, Portman appeared in Woody Allen's Everyone Says I Love You, a musical comedy about a sprawling family in Manhattan singing and dancing their way through their domestic difficulties. This film boasted an equally big cast (Drew Barrymore, Goldie Hawn, Edward Norton, and Alan Alda among them) but fared far more successfully with critics, if not the public. Still, this film afforded Portman the opportunity to sing in this highly entertaining film.

The last of these films, Beautiful Girls, once again had a large ensemble (Uma Thurman, Timothy Hutton, and Rosie O'Donnell), but also gave Portman a chance to shine as a young girl in love with an older man (Timothy Hutton). Her precocious performance won more good notices from critics and cemented her reputation as a very talented young actress to watch.

Following her triple features of 1996, Portman headed for Broadway in the lead role in a revival of The Diary of Anne Frank. Once again, Portman received strong notices for her portrayal of the young Dutch girl who hides in an attic with her family in order to survive the Holocaust. This play also marked a notable change of pace for Portman, who until now had been cast largely in daughter-type roles, but with this play finally got the chance to take on a lead role, and a strong one at that.

Even with several critically praised film roles and an excellent Broadway debut, Portman had yet to achieve a major box office success, something that was destined to change when she signed on to one of the most anticipated films in history, George Lucas' Star Wars prequel, The Phantom Menace. The film, which also stars Ewan McGregor and Liam Neeson, cast Portman as Queen Amidala, the young queen who will eventually become wife to Anakin Skywalker, mother to Luke and Leia.

Though no one can really anticipate just how successful the film will be, it is certain to be a huge cinematic event that will immortalize Portman in film history. Even so, whether or not The Phantom Menace is a blockbuster, Lucas is committed to making two more prequels with Portman signed on to reprise her role. Part two, due out in 2002, has not yet started filming, but part of the storyline is said to center around the love story between


> Portman's Queen Amidala and Anakin Skywalker. Though this film will also likely be huge success, a lot of anticipation rides on whether or not Portman can ignite the screen with Anakin, a role that has yet to be cast for the next two films.

> In the meantime, Portman has made plans for going to college as she awaits for The Phantom Menace to change her life. By the time the next part of the saga opens, Portman will be a mere 21 years old. Already an accomplished actress with several critically acclaimed roles, a successful run on Broadway, and one of the biggest blockbusters of the decade under her belt, Natalie Portman will have packed a lot into her relatively short time in the spotlight. Beyond that, what the future holds for this highly-regarded young actress promises to be well-worth finding out.

Next up for Natalie Portman

Portman reprises her role as Queen Amidala in the next two Star Wars films, along with co-stars Ewan McGregor and Samuel L. Jackson. This first film begins filming this summer and is due for release in 2002, with the third film due out in 2005.

that you are a little angel who has no powers but flying around! So how does this game go on?


