# Credits to govt sector now more than that to pvt sector

80pc bank loans to private sector are influenced by ministers, MPs and political leaders

For the first time in the country's history, net credits to the government sector from the banking system has surpassed that to the private sector, renowned economist and Chairman of the Bank Reforms Committee Prof Wahiduddin Mahmud has said.

Of the bank loans to the private sector, 80 per cent are influenced by ministers. MPs, political leaders and union leaders, the former advisor to the

last caretaker government said. Mahmud, a professor of Dhaka University, was speaking at a seminar on "Politics of Bangladesh and the Changes in Banking", organised by the Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management (BIBM) at its auditorium vesterday.

Presided over by BIBM Director General Dr Muinul Islam. the seminar was also addressed by Senior Research Fellow of BIDS Dr Atiur Rahman.

Earlier, the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court directed the Special Court to frame charges against the accused under Section 6(1) and 14 of the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act 1995.

As per the directive the Special Court framed charges against the principal accused Shahid under Section 6(1) of the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act 1995 and five others under Section 6(1) and 14 of the Act.

Charges were framed against the six accused on April 13, 1999. But the lawyers for the two accused Minu and Perveen - filed a "Criminal Appeal" with the High Court Division of the Supreme Court to set aside the order passed by the Special Court.

The High Court after hearing both the side stayed the operation of the case on July 6 last.

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court vacated the stay order of the High Court Division upon a petition filed by the prosecution lawyers on February 17, 2000.
