GLASGOW, May 28: Rangers predictably beat Aberdeen 4-0 in the final of the Scottish FA Cup here at Hampden Park on Saturday, reports AFP.

The match between Rangers, Premiership champions and Aberdeen who propped up the bottom of the table was never expected to last long as a con-

But the game became an even more one-sided affair when two minutes into the match Aberdeen's veteran 41-year-old goalkeeper Jim Leighton was carried off in the final game of his career.

Former Manchester United and Scotland keeper Leighton, who made his name under Sir Alex Ferguson at Aberdeen, sustained a suspected broken jaw after a collision with Rod Wal-

It was another piece of cruel Cup luck for Leighton who was omitted from Manchester United's 1991 FA Cup final replay winning side by Ferguson after a poor performance in the first match against Crystal Palace.

"If we had just held out for Aberdeen, with no keeper listed among only three substitutes, were faced with a nightmare scenario.

Robbie Winters, a striker, came on as substitute and took to field wearing second choice Ryan Esson's shirt as a makeshift keeper leaving the Dons at once primed for a severe defeat.

They survived the first half with only the loss of a Giovanni Van Bronckhorst strike after 35 minutes, but Rangers started the second half with a goal blitz of three strikes in five minutes.

Tony Vidmar struck first after 47 minutes with a shot from just inside the area, before Billy Dodds nodded in a third and Jorg Albertz thumped in a fourth to leave the Dons reeling.




