#### BB to set up micro finance monitoring unit

Bangladesh Bank will set up a new unit, Micro Finance Research and Reference, for monitoring the on-going micro finance programmes in the country, reports BSS.

The decision came at a meeting on Micro Finance of Non-Government Organisations (NGOs) and Micro Finance Institutes (MFI) with Finance Minister Shah A M S Kibria in the chair.

The meeting also formed an eleven-member steering committee headed by Bangladesh Bank Governor to conduct operation of the unit. The other members of the committee will include representatives from Finance Ministry, Social Welfare Ministry, Grameen Bank, PKSF, BRAC, ADAB, NGO Bureau, CDF and Bangladesh

During the next three years. the committee will prepare and introduce guidelines, standard reporting format, accounting standards and other necessary policies for NGOs and MFIs.
