

# Arsenic menace in Kushtia

KUSHTIA, June 3: A large number of people in six upazilas of the district have been passing their days amid arsenic threat.

Arsenic invaded the areas back in 1997 when 26 people of two families at village Islampur under Mokaripur union of Bheramara upazila were attacked with arsenic related diseases. A 60-year-old man succumbed to the diseases. He was identified as Montaz Ali.

Rezauul Karim, son of the victim, said he took his father to many doctors in the country and in India but his death could not be prevented. Another seven persons of his family were also attacked with the diseases.

Ten persons of the family of his uncle were also attacked with the diseases. The victims were taken to local physicians who advised them to examine the water of the tubewell they

were consuming. After the examination, arsenic beyond permissible level was found in water.

When contacted executive engineer of local Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) told this correspondent that he visited the place and collected the water for test.

However, the PHED recently sealed six tubewells in Khermerdia, Ramkrishnapur and Fakirabad of Bheramara upazila where about 45 people have been attacked with arsenic related diseases. Besides, one tubewell in Khoksa upazila, four in Kushtia town, one in Joggil union of Sadar upazila and one in Daulatpur upazila were sealed.

Residents in Kushtia Meherpur, Chaudanga, Jhenidah, Chapainawabganj, Naogaon, Khulna and Rajshahi

have been badly affected by arsenic contamination, according to Health Department source.

Benagari, a hamlet in neighbouring Chuadanga district, has been identified as arsenic affected village. Mohiuddin, 26, son of Akbar Ali and Abdul Qudus, 28, son of Surajuddin of the village were admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH) after they had developed arsenic related complications.

According to survey reports of different NGOs, 75 per cent of the population of the village have developed arsenic related diseases. The condition of 40 per cent people is stated to be critical.

Mohammad Ali, son of Huzur Ali and Shahidul Islam, son of Komed Sardar of the village, died of arsenic related complications last year.

Meanwhile, people in affected areas are compelled to drink arsenic contaminated water risking their lives in absence of alternative measures.

A team of local journalists recently visited some rural areas of Kushtia Sadar, Bheramara and Mirpur upazilas and talked to locals. Local people said many tubewells in the area have been sealed by the PHED following detection of arsenic contamination in waters. But alternative arrangement has not been made. They said alternative measures should be made immediately.

A survey revealed Ramkrishnapur, Gopanthpur, Golanagar, Farirabad, Bahadur Junaidaha, Jagaswar of Bheramara and Ogoberia and Ramkrishnapur of Daulatpur upazilas are badly affected areas.

# Trend of abduction on rise in Laxmipur

LAXMIPUR, June 3: The trend of abduction for ransom has taken an alarming upswing here, raising fears among the locals. The blame for it goes to police for their inaction, reports UNB.

According to competent sources, an organised gang of notorious criminals kidnapped 20 people and realised Tk 11 lakh from their relatives in Sadar and Ramgati upazilas in last five months.

Although there is a police camp at Duttapara in the middle of the villages, 19 people were abducted from six villages in Sadar upazila during the period.

Of the 19 kidnapping incidents, only one case was filed with local police. The relatives of other victims refrained from seeking help from the law-enforcers for fear of reprisal. Most of the victims were ex-

patriate Bangladeshis living in various countries and fell prey to the kidnapers on return home. Their relatives had to pay ransoms ranging from Tk 50,000 to Tk 1.5 lakh for their release.

Villagers blamed the local police for turning a blind eye to the terrorists. "Police do not move until their palms are greased," said a villager.

Over 50 women were also raped by the members of 'Anwar Bahini', a terrorist group, in Koraitala, Shahidpur, Sreemurpur, Mollapat, West Barali villages in the last five months, but no case was filed with the police.

On May 21, the ruffians kidnapped Belal Hujur of Shahidpur village. "His fault was that he had filed a case against the Anwar Bahini," said one of his relatives.

## Field day of IPM

THAKURGAON, June 3: A Field day of Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Farmers' Field School was held at village Fakdanpur under Thakurgaon sadar upazila recently, reports BSS.

The field day was organised as a part of Directorate of Agriculture Extension (DAE) 14-week training programme of IPM farmers across the country. The field day was organised by District Directorate of Agriculture Extension (DAE) and attended by local farmers and students of IPM school.

DAE has taken IPM programme to control the pests of paddy and vegetables through biological, light trap, netting and other methods without using chemical pesticides.

## Massive credit programme

SHERPUR, June 3: Social Welfare Department is implementing a massive credit programme here in an attempt to improve the socioeconomic condition of the poor, reports UNB.

Officials said interest free loan totaling Tk 1.17 crore has so far been distributed among 16,299 families at 636 villages under the department's Poverty Alleviation Programme while Tk 2.65 lakh among 1,478 families under Urban Social Welfare Programme. The loan recovery rate is 84 and 93 per cent respectively, officials said. Besides, a total of 4,680 people of the district have been receiving Tk 100 each every month under the government's old age allowance programme. Meanwhile, applications of 2,385 distressed women of the district have been scrutinized for providing allowance Tk 100 each from September last year, the officials said.

# Flood situation improves in Moulvibazar dist

MOULVIBAZAR, June 3: Overall flood situation in Moulvibazar district improved on Thursday with waters of the Monu and Dhalai rivers started receding. The river Monu is now flowing at 12.44 metre which is 0.69 metre above the danger mark. The reading of water level was taken on May 30, reports BSS.

Road communication of Moulvibazar-Kamalganj Srimongal-Brahminabaz still remained disrupted.

According to District Control Room, which was set up at the office of the Deputy Commissioner, a total of 3,000 houses and 150 kilometres of road damaged by flood water, 8,000 acres of seedbeds were also completely damaged.

A total of Taka 60,000 were sanctioned to distribute dry food among flood victims.

UNB from Chapainawabganj says: Some roads, culverts and other infrastructures damaged

by last two year's flooding here are yet to be repaired causing sufferings to the people.

The damaged roads include the three-km Charmoronpur-Tikrampur road in sadar upazila and eight-km Kalinagar-Moharajpur road in shoal area, which were badly damaged in the 1998 and 1999 flood.

Besides, a sluice gate and embankment in Marichardara are now under threat as no step has been taken to repair those.

The embankment was protected during last year's flood with emergency repair work. Local people apprehended that breaches might develop at any time in the damaged embankment in the current rainy season threatening crops on 32,000 hectares of land in the area.

When contacted, local MP Harunur Rashid blamed negligence of concerned authority and bureaucratic tangle, which delayed the repair of the roads, culverts and embankment.

# Caretaker of Mujibnagar rest house not getting salary

JESSORE, June 3: Caretaker of Zila Parishad duk bungalow, or rest house, at Mujibnagar in Meherpur district has not been getting his salary for the last four years.

Rezauul Karim has been working with the rest house since 1996. He, however, has no appointment letter.

Karim's father Nur Mohammad, a freedom fighter of Kushtia Zila Parishad rest house in 1973. He was later posted to Mujibnagar rest house in 1980.

Nur Mohammad developed cancer in last part of nineties. When he became quite unable to work his son Rezauul Karim replaced him. He began to work from 1996. Nur Mohammad died on January 27, 2000.

But the Meherpur Zila Parishad authority is yet to finalise Karim's appointment, causing sufferings to the poor man, who has to maintain his family.

# Workshop in Pabna 7,000 arsenic victims identified so far

SIRAJGANJ, June 3: A two-day media workshop on 'Arsenic mitigation programme' was held on May 25 and 27 at Pabna Zilla Parishad auditorium. Fifty journalists of the northern region participated in the workshop. Pabna Press Club and UNICEF, Bangladesh jointly organised the workshop.

June Kungi, chief of information and advocacy, UNICEF, Bangladesh inaugurated the workshop. Among others, communication officer of UNICEF Chinmoy Mushudi, arsenic team leader Shaiful Islam, DC of Pabna Mahbubur Rahman, DPHE engineer M Saifuddin, communication officer Onish Borua spoke on the occasion.

Speakers said Bangladesh is poor country and river erosion is a common phenomenon in this country. People of the riverside areas are mostly arsenic affected. But

they do not know the reason of arsenic contamination. New its protection is essential. Journalist Anowarul Haque of Pabna, Abdus Satter Basu, president, Pabna Press Club, Abdul Matin Khan, Mahbubul Alam, editor the Daily Uttar Barta, Jugantor northern region correspondent Hasibur Rahman Bilu, The Daily Star correspondent Akhteruzzaman Bablu, Shankor Kumar, A B M Fazlur Rahman, Abdul Mazid, Naresh Modhu of the Daily Uttar Barta and editor Matiuur Rahman, among others, spoke on the occasion.

Arsenic is soluble in water. It is still not clear why some members of a family or community are affected, while others are not affected.

Dhaka Community Hospital (DCH) has done some extraordinary work in identification of arsenic patients, providing

treatment for them and doing large scale advocacy focusing this issue.

About 7,000 arsenic affected patients have been identified so far in Bangladesh. Of them 120 in Bera thana under Pabna district. On the 2nd day of the workshop journalists accompanied with UNICEF representatives visited the Bera thana arsenic affected areas.

They shifted many arsenic affected people to Dhaka DCH for treatment. Of them, Momota Khatun, wife of Siddique Ali, and her daughter Surma Khatun, 15, Shilpi, 13, Sabiha, 12, Sumi, 7, came from Monakasha village under Bera thana of Pabna district. UNICEF leaders said with the assistance of UNICEF tubewell in rural areas are tested.

The workshop was presided over by the Pabna Press Club president.

# Shrimps under viral attack in Satkhira

SATKHIRA, June 3: Viral disease has broken out recently in an epidemic form in the shrimp enclosures in Assasuni and Shymnagar upazilas affecting shrimp production. This has created panic among shrimp farmers who released fries of shrimp in their enclosures, reports BSS.

Shrimp growers said, shrimps worth about Taka 1.5 crore have been damaged by the viral disease in the enclosures in the two upazilas. Worst affected areas are Sritula, Shovnali and Anulla union in Assasuni upazila and Atulia, Padmapukur and Gabura in Shymnagar upazila.

Shrimp farmers of Assasuni and Shymnagar said they had found very small sized shrimps in their enclosures with white spots on its body, tails and fins and the colour of the fishes have been changed into red. While attacked by the viral disease most of the shrimps died within two or three days, they

complained. Chairman Nurul Alam of Anulla Union, owner of a 200 Eightas enclosure, said most of the shrimps of his enclosure died due to this disease. He wants to release fries again in February next as most of the fries, released in October, died.

District Fisheries Officer (DFO) of Satkhira Habibur Rahman told that he was receiving such complains frequently and he already visited many shrimp enclosures. He said except viral disease, deterioration of bottom soil of the enclosures is another cause of the loss.

He advised the shrimp farmers to keep the shrimps in appropriate environment and develop water system for healthy growth of shrimps. He also advised for limited use of fertiliser. When the shrimps are affected by the viral disease chlorine, iodine and formalin can be used in the enclosures, he added.

# Cotton farming in Panchagarh may fall short of target

PANCHAGARH, June 3: Despite having a bright prospect for cotton cultivation here, the production target may not be achieved in the current season due to lack of proper patronisation and unfavorable weather condition, reports UNB.

Cotton Development Board brought 2,705 acres of land under cotton cultivation in Thakurgaon zone comprising of Dulpur, Thakurgaon and Panchagarh districts this year with a production target of 40,575 maunds.

Of the total, some 536 acres of land were brought under cotton cultivation here alone with an output target at 8,040 maunds.

Cotton on 2,273 acres of land was cultivated in Thakurgaon zone last year under the supervision of Cotton Development Board.

CDB sources said cotton plants on 600 acres of land were

# Storms claim six lives in Gaibandha

GAIBANDHA, June 3: Storms claimed at least six lives recently in the district. Besides, at least ten people were also injured during the period.

Of them, three persons were killed as uprooted trees fell on them and three others were electrocuted as they came in touch with live wire snapped from poles during storms, known as norwester.

Kasar Ali, 56, and his cousin Mintu Mia, 10, of village Ujan Bochagari under Sunderganj upazila died when an uprooted jack-fruit tree fell on them during storm. Another unidentified man died as an uprooted tree fell on him at Birat Bazaar under Gobindganj upazila.

Palash, 11, of village Chandra Vita under Sadar upazila, Jaluddin, 20, of Sunderganj upazila and Labu, 25, of village Kanchipara under Fulchhari upazila were electrocuted in separate incidents when they came in touch with live wire snapped from electric poles during storms.

# Cotton farming in Panchagarh may fall short of target

An official of CDB said a massive programme has been taken up for cotton cultivation in 23 upazilas under Thakurgaon zone through its 12 units offices.

Local farmers said a vast tract of land here could be brought under high yielding variety of cotton cultivation if commercial banks launch micro-credit programme.
