Budget session resumes today

Budget session of the Jatiya Sangsad resumes at 9.30 am today after a two-day recess following presentation of the budget for 2000-01 on Thursday.

The House is expected to start today general discussion on the supplementary budget for the current financial year with the Opposition continuing abstention from attending the parliament session.

Rejecting the new budget, the BNP-led opposition alliance has called a countrywide 12-hour hartal across the country tomorrow to protest it.

The budget session began on June 5 and may continue till the end of next month. Opposition MPs are contemplating a token participation in the session to protect their seats as those will fall vacant if the current session continues for more than 30 days.

BNP to bring out torch processions today

The BNP-led opposition has called the countrywide shutdown to protest the proposed 'anti-people' national budget.

Yesterday's joint meeting observed that the proposed budget would create a social crisis as what it said the budgetary



President Assad dead

DAMASCUS, June 10: Syrian President Hafez al-Assad died today of a heart attack just before midday, a medical source told AFP. He was 69.

Assad, who had a stroke a few weeks ago, had been recovering, but his heart failed, the source said.

The Syrian leader was suffering from diabetes, heart problems and a kind of blood cancer which develops slowly, it said.

The Syrian parliament later changed the constitution today to allow Bashar al-Assad, 34, to be a candidate to succeed his father.

The constitution had stipulated that a candidate must be aged at least 40.

Hafez al-Assad ruled with an iron grip for nearly 30 years to bring stability to his once coup-ridden country and become a key player on the Middle Eastern stage.

The death of the 69-year-old general, who seized power in November 1970.

An expert on Syrian affairs, who asked not to be identified, said the Syrian president had been in an advanced stage of diabetes that "affected his

Tullow rejects, Chevron accepts

Negotiations take a new turn as govt wants BAPEX to be the operator in Block 9

Star Report

Negotiations between Chevron-Tullow and BAPEX for a Production Sharing Contract (PSC) for Block 9 took a new turn on Thursday as the government suggested that BAPEX would be the operator in the block.

The proposal was turned down by Tullow but Chevron accepted it. Texaco was not present at the negotiations led by the Energy Secretary.

The meeting ended with the decision that Chevron and Tullow would have to take a decision themselves over the government's new proposal and then sit for negotiations.

Chevron-Texaco and Tullow were about to initial a PSC for Block 9 before the visit of US President Bill Clinton in March. However, a last moment change of decision by Texaco to look into PSC options sus-

pend the process. At that time, it was decided that the block's equity would be shared between the three companies by 30 per cent each while BAPEX would get 10 per cent as carried interest. Tullow was suggested to be the operator in the block.

Later in April, Texaco sent a letter to Chevron, with a copy forwarded to the government, saying that it would sign the PSC jointly but would transfer its part of equity to Chevron after the signing.

The letter written in a plain paper without a letterhead confused the government because such decisions were perceived as internal affairs of the two companies and forwarding it to Petrobangla did not have a clear cut purpose.

Meanwhile, an unofficial level both Chevron and Tullow had been hammering the idea of

being the operator.

However, Petrobangla late last month invited all the three foreign companies to finalise their partnership.

At Thursday's meeting, Chevron initially argued that as per the present configuration of partnership, it would provide 60 per cent of the financing in exploration and production of oil and gas in the block. Therefore, it should be made the operator. But finally it agreed to the government proposal.

Tullow argued that it was Tullow's bid, which was the basis of all negotiations and therefore Tullow should be the operator.

Tullow was chosen as the best bidder for this block by the government as it had proposed to drill 10 exploratory wells at a clear cut purpose.

Mugging, other crimes rising in Chittagong

CHITTAGONG, June 10: Incidents of mugging and other crimes have gone up in the port city.

Over 100 incidents of mugging took place in the city in the last two months, police said.

Police officials said special measures were taken with launching of raids at different places of the city to curb the recent rise of crime.

A shop was looted by armed terrorists at Agrabad South Land centre yesterday afternoon, police and witnesses said.

The terrorists looted goods worth over Tk 20 lakh from the shop at 2-30 pm as its owner earlier refused to pay toll of Tk one lakh to the gang, sources said.

None was arrested in this connection so far.

In another incident, a group of muggers took away Tk two lakh of Chittagong Grammar School, an English medium school in the city yesterday afternoon, police said.

The muggers intercepted the

microbus of the school at a place near Chittagong Medical College Hospital at about 3 pm while the accountant of the school was carrying the money to deposit with bank, police said.

After snatching the money, muggers fled the scene by an autorickshaw.

The day before yesterday Tk 16 lakh was looted by gunmen from a Korean Factory located in the restricted area of Chittagong Export Processing Zone (CEPZ).

None was arrested in this regard so far, police said, adding that hunt was on to nab the gunmen and recover the looted money.

The incident triggered panic among the investors in CEPZ, sources said.

On Tuesday, Tk 1.5 lakh was snatched from a book trader at Anderkilla at 11 am and on Monday the muggers stabbed a businessman and took away Tk ten thousand from him at Karpasola in the city.

Men of 2 peers clash again: 7 injured

At least seven people were injured during a renewed clash between the followers of Peer of Charminar and Dewanbagh area in the city yesterday, witnesses said.

Jamaat activists backed the followers of Peer of Dewanbagh, witnesses said.

Officials of the Islamic Foundation which is responsible for looking after the mosque said the clashes took place outside the mosque and some people took refuge in the mosque.

Police dispersed the rival groups but no case was registered and none was arrested, Motijheel police said.

A press release issued by the Islamic Constitution Movement (ICM) of the Peer of Char-

minar confirmed the clash but did not mention how it erupted and how many people were injured. Jamaat leaders were not available for their comments yesterday.

Of the injured, two identified as Nur-e-Alam Siddique, driver of a vehicle of Jamaat-e-Islami and Golam Rasul, an activist of the same organisation, were rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), while others were taken to different hospitals, witnesses said.

Siddique was admitted to the hospital in a critical condition with injuries in his eyes and head, hospital sources said.

At least 25 people were injured in a clash between the two groups soon after Juma prayers on Friday.

SSC exam results today
