USTC imparts quality education
Dhaka campus opens with new subjects

Speakers at a meeting yesterday praised the success of Bangladeshi medical professionals at home and abroad and said that Bangladeshi's efficiency in different medical disciplines have been recognised around the world.

"Bangladeshi medical pro-

fessionals have proved their skill in medical science as well as teaching and earned a distinction in the field," National Professor Nurul Islam said while addressing the opening ceremony of the Dhaka Campus of University of Science and Technology Chittagong (USTC).

Prof Islam, who is the founder vice-chancellor of the university said that USTC has already earned a good reputation in foreign countries, and about 33 per cent of its students are from abroad.

"This has been made possible due to discharge of quality education and the total dedication of its staff members," he said.

Earlier, Prof Nurul Islam briefly described the establishment of the country's first ever private sector university on science and technology, established at Chittagong in 1992.

He said that the Dhaka Campus has been launched with three courses on Computer Science, Executive MBA and Family Medicine Diploma.

Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed, who attended the function as chief guest lauded the success of Bangladeshi medical professionals at home and abroad.

The minister stressed upon the need of expansion of IT education and hoped that the USTC will be able to produce prospective manpower in the IT sector to contribute to the national development.

The minister said that IT had now become the most important part of global affairs and the present government had given top priority to its rapid development in the greater national interest.

The Industries Minister highly appreciated the venture of Prof Nurul Islam in establishing an institute dedicated to promotion and teaching of medical science and said "A world renowned physician and educationist like him will always remain a source of inspiration for others in such fields."

Workshop on draft policies of participatory water management

Local Government Minister Zillur Rahman yesterday hoped that the participatory water management regulations would help implement the government water policies ensuring participation of people, reports UNB.

He said participation of the people would be a milestone in proper and integrated use of water resources.
