**Taltala Park belongs to Rajuk but DCC sweepers occupy it**

The Gulshan Taltala park and its adjacent area belongs to Rajuk but it could not be recovered from DCC sweepers and a group of people who have illegally set up a mosque, an orphange and a *darbar sharif*, Rajuk officials claimed.

They said about three acres of land, designated for a public park, were handed over to DCC (Dhaka City Corporation) for maintenance few years ago. But soon after, a slum sprang up along with a mosque, an orphange and a *darbar sharif*.

Now, the whole area resembles a slum with mushrooming structures of different party offices and other establishments which are officially classified as "too sensitive to touch", a Rajuk source said.

"If you grab a land and build a mosque, a temple, a shrine or an orphange, it is not always

**2 former outlaws gunned down in Kushtia**

KUSHTIA, June 18: Two former outlaws were gunned down while another received bullet injuries in an attack today on the Kushtia-Jhenaidah road, 13 miles off the town, reports UNB.

Police said the victims, former members of outlawed parties, surrendered at the call of the Home Minister on June 28, 1999 to avail an amnesty and were released recently.

The deceased were identified as Abul Hashem, 25, and Abdur Rahman, 30. Seriously injured Apple was rushed to local hospital.

"The gunmen shot them pointblank at 9 am at Laxmipur Bus Stand on the road," says a witness.

Police handed over the bodies to their relatives after post-mortem examinations at Sadar Hospital.

Police held three persons for interrogation but did not disclose their identity "for sake of investigation".

## Minister's 'no' to budgetary allocation for parties

Speakers at a dialogue propose one per cent of budget for transparency

Speakers at a dialogue in the city yesterday proposed making provisions for budgetary allocation for political parties for the sake of transparency but State Minister for Planning Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir said it would not be possible due to financial constraints.

"It won't be a proper step at this stage of development. The very essence of budget making is to change the lot of the poor and it won't be possible to allocate money for the political

parties ignoring those projects," Alamgir said.

However, Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed said everybody has to think about developing a transparent system for financing the political parties.

Earlier, Chairman of the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) Prof. Rehman Sobhan

proposed that one per cent of the total budget should be allocated for financing the political

parties for their activities and the proposal was supported

by most of the participants in the dialogue.

Prof. Sobhan was the keynote speaker at the dialogue on "State of Governance and Budget Responses 2000" organised by CPD and held at CIRDAP auditorium.

The participants felt that source of funds of the political parties is one of the major reasons for degradation of politics in the country.

When some speakers pointed

**2 top extremists of southern region held in city**

Police arrested two top extremists of southern region from city's Uttara area early yesterday, reports UNB.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of the Special Branch raided a government quarter and arrested Sadiur Rahman Thandu and Jahid Kabir.

The swoop was made on information that some leaders and workers of an underground extremist organisation of Jhenidah-Shailakupa area were in a meeting in a hideout at Uttara.

Police investigation revealed that some leaders and workers of the extremist party took shelter in the hideout to carry out subversive activity in Dhaka," says a news release.



**Farmers and consumers pay for it**

Farmers at a Jessor village yesterday sold *potol* (palwal) at Tk 6 per kg. When a trader hired a truck and brought those to Karwan Bazar wholesale market in the city, another Tk 2 was added to its price. By the time the vegetable reaches your kitchen, you have paid about Tk 14 for one kilogram.

Whatever vegetables you buy from the city's kitchen markets, you pay more than double the price the farmers get for their produce. The farmers are miserably deprived of a fair price and the consumers are silently subjected to a penalty because, in between, stand *masatans*, police, extortionists.

There are exorbitant transport and labour costs also. A truck charges up to Tk 8,000 for a trip to Dhaka from Jessor.

Abdul Hai, who brought a truck-load of *potol* yesterday from a Jessor village to Karwan Bazar said extortion begins right from the moment a farmer comes to the local market to sell his produce.

"When I buy vegetables, I have to pay toll at the local market, then all along the road up to Dhaka. I have labour and

**Arrest of newsman**  
Calcutta police yet to confirm identity

The Indian police in Calcutta could not confirm till yesterday identity of the Bangladeshi journalist who was arrested there on Thursday on suspicion instead of Shaiful, one of the three accused in the sensational Iftekhar Ahmed Shipu murder case, Detective Branch officials in Dhaka said.

The DB is yet ascertain whereabouts of the three FIR-listed accused in the case. They are Shaiful Alam, son of Ahmad Hossain; Naimuzzaman Jubair, son of Asaduzzaman, Director of Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) and Jewel son of ruling party MP Kamal Majumder.

Asked why a journalist who had gone there for treatment was arrested instead of the accused, a police source in Dhaka said, "It was probably due to confusion over names". He however, would not speak further.

Bangladesh's Deputy High Commissioner in Calcutta told The Daily Star over tele-
