

Ruling party starts politicisation of admin to cling to power: Khaleda

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday said the ruling Awami League has become desperate to cling to power and started massive politicisation of administration with this end in view.

She said the AL government is now appointing "controversial and own partymen" in vital positions and offices, including the Election Commission as part of its conspiracy to return to power.

Addressing a group of professionals at her 29 Minto Road official residence, the Leader of the Opposition in Parliament said the government has completely failed to develop any sector. Rather, terrorism, repression and falsehood have been increased.

The Chittagong Unit of Professional Action Council led by its president Prof Mohammad Nurun-Nabi and general secretary Shamsuddin Ahmed Mirza called on Khaleda Zia and informed her about the situation of the port city.

The BNP Chairperson said people of all professions, especially the businessmen are now scared of terrorism and extortion. Sons of Ministers and MPs are involved in murders and terrorism, but no action is being taken against them.

Lauding the role of the council, the opposition leader advised the leaders of the organisation to form such action council all over Bangladesh.

JS body for aggressive marketing policy with neighbouring states

The JS Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs has proposed adoption of an aggressive marketing policy with India and other neighbouring countries.

The marketing policy should be followed to reduce the gap in trading of agricultural and other commercial commodities and also to help develop human resources.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the JS Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs at Sangsab Bhaban on June 21. It was presided over by Dr Muhammad Selim.

The meeting was told that the present government wanted to improve the economic condition and living standard of the people and that foreign policy guidelines were accordingly prepared.

It was stressed that only by pursuing proper economic diplomacy and economic re-

Shipment deadline expires June 30
Frozen shrimps lying at port for over 2 weeks

KHULNA, June 24: Over 120 containers of frozen shrimps worth Tk 150 crore have been lying at Mongla port for over two weeks, shrimp exporters said.

The deadline for shipment of the shrimps will expire on June 30. Buyers will cancel their contracts if these shrimps are not shipped within the deadline.

The cancellation of contracts will hit hard the exporters of Khulna zone because most of them are heavily burdened with bank loans.

Besides, they are yet to complete payment to the growers from whom shrimps were purchased at rates higher than the previous year.

Despite repeated reminders, steps are yet to be taken to send two feeder vessels from Chittagong for shipment of the shrimps at Mongla port.

Two feeder vessels — MV Dafa (voyage no 143) and MV Eagle Sky (voyage no 232) — were scheduled to carry the shrimps. But they failed as they

Actor Shawkat Akbar dead

Eminent film actor Shawkat Akbar died of a heart attack on Thursday night at a London hospital, thus bringing an end to a long career in the Dhaka film industry that spanned about 36 years, reports BSS.

At the age of 62, the widely respected gentleman and handsome actor of the silver screen breathed his last leaving an unaccounted number of colleagues and fans to mourn his death.

Shawkat Akbar, who had been residing in London since 1996, left behind his wife, a son and a daughter. His namaz-e-janaza was held at East London Mosque on Friday and he was laid to rest at Waltham Muslim Graveyard, a message received

Help govt reach healthcare facilities to all, PM asks physicians

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has asked the physicians to work with service-oriented mentality, ensure best possible treatment and help the government reach healthcare facilities to all, reports UNB.

"It's not possible for the government alone ... the private sector should come forward to ensure medical services for all," she said inaugurating a Community Welfare and Health Care Centre at Dhanmondi in the afternoon yesterday.

The centre, a public-private joint venture, is an organ of Bangladesh Medical Studies and Research Institute.

The government provided Tk 8.18 crore for the project which was completed at a cost of Tk 22 crore. The centre is maintaining a 230-bed hospital and providing most modern treatment to the patients, organisers said.

They said, poor patients are getting free treatment in the hospital, where 30 beds have been kept reserved for the poor patients.

So far, 1,174 students in 14 batches were admitted to Bangladesh Medical College, the study section of the institute, and 298 of them got the MBBS degree.

The Prime Minister said attention should be given to the poor people can get the modern treatment and elaborated government's steps for reaching medical services to the doorsteps of the people.

Flash floods in Assam: Over 1 lakh marooned

GUWAHATI, India, June 24: Flash floods triggered by heavy monsoon rains have marooned more than 100,000 people in the Indian state of Assam and severed the north-eastern region's road links with the rest of the country, officials said today, reports AFP.

The Assam government had announced a red alert with the Brahmaputra river, flowing at least two metres (6.6 feet) above the danger level.

Officials said more than 30 people have died in Assam and in adjoining Arunachal Pradesh state in the floods, which began two weeks ago.

"Road links between the northeastern region and the rest of India remained snapped since Friday with floods waters washing away two bridges on the national highway," John Ingli Kathar, the district magistrate of Assam's Kokrajhar district told AFP.

"If incessant rains continue, maybe rail links connecting the northeast with the rest of the country might be affected."

Assam's capital Guwahati has turned into a virtual lake with heavy showers since Thursday flooding almost the

entire city. "Six districts of Assam are reeling under flood waters with the Brahmaputra rising menacingly affecting more than 100,000 people. The situation is indeed grim and alarming," a flood control officials said.

He said flood victims were taking shelter in relief camps or schools and colleges located on higher ground.

The world's largest river island of Majuli in eastern Assam was inundated and locals were marooned.


