

Ransacking of BGMEA office was outburst of frustration

Owners of 'marginalised' units say

The ransacking of BGMEA office on Sunday was the outburst of frustration of a section of small garments factory owners as BGMEA leadership failed to solve their long-standing problems, some owners said.

They said small factory owners feel 'marginalised' by BGMEA, which do not try to solve their problems but favour big companies, an allegation denied by BGMEA president Anisur Rahman Sinha.

If the problems are not solved immediately, many factories will face closure soon, they told this correspondent during a visit to the BGMEA office yesterday.

CHITTAGONG, June 26: Some agitating workers of the three towel factories of US company Qualities Group at the CEPZ began a 'fast unto death' in front of Chittagong Press Club from 10 am today demanding reinstatement of 15 workers and reopening of the mills.

Their hunger strike continued till writing of this report at 8 tonight.

Several hundred agitating workers of those factories also brought out a procession at 5 pm that paraded the city roads. The procession terminated near the local Press Club.

Earlier, the workers observed sit-in in front of the factories. The agitation began June 11 after 15 workers of the three towel factories were sacked. CEPZ sources said.

CEPZ officials held a meeting with the leaders of agitating workers yesterday to resolve the crisis, but it ended inconclusively, official sources said.

As a result the workers did not return to duties and production in those 3 factories remained suspended.

Cargo handling
resumes at
Ctg port

CHITTAGONG, June 26: Cargo handling resumed at Chittagong port at 9 am today after about 37 hours due to a wildcat strike by dock workers, port sources said.

The dock workers of Chittagong port went on strike from 8 pm on Saturday centring a dispute with the stevedores over a demand for 'tips' or extra money, the sources added.

The workers were supposed to resume their duties from 8 pm yesterday as per the decision at a meeting of their leaders, stevedores and port officials.

But due to a clash between two groups of labourers at the time of gang booking at 8 pm yesterday, booking was stopped. Some agitating workers ransacked the booking office, port and police sources said.

However, the dock workers took the gang-booking from 8 am today and started cargo handling activities at 9 am.

The city has become unfit for living

No security of life & property,
say Opposition leaders

PDB threatens to cut off power supply to 7 jute mills in Khulna

KHULNA, June 26: The Power Development Board (PDB) has threatened to cut off power supply to seven state-owned jute mills in Khulna from this evening unless they pay Tk 60 crore in outstanding bills soon.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC), which owns the mills, sought two months' time for the payment.

Sources said more than 20,000 workers will be out of jobs if the power connection to the mills is cut off.

None of the seven state-owned jute mills bothered to pay any amount of outstanding bills despite frequent reminders said a PDB source, adding June 24 was the deadline for payment.

The PDB alleges that the jute mills are unwilling to pay the electricity bills although they do not mind buying raw materials, spare parts and fuel in cash. Besides, they all are misusing electricity, said a high PDB official.

Khafrul Alam, zonal manager of BJMC, said, "We are not in a position even to pay wages of workers. So, how can we manage money to pay the electricity bills? All these state-owned jute mills are about to be bankrupt."

Test status to Bangladesh would be officially announced later at a press conference of the ICC at 1600 GMT (10pm, BST) on Monday in London.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh began a five-day state celebration yesterday marking the singular achievement of Bangladesh in the 123-year history of Test cricket.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will attend the main celebration on Wednesday at Paltan Maidan at 4:30 pm.

Earlier, in 1977, Bangladesh got associate membership of the ICC after an MCC team, visiting Bangladesh first since the country's independence in 1971, recommended inclusion of the South Asian nation in to world cricket.

Bangladesh cricket got a momentum when it emerged as the 1997 ICC Trophy champions and qualified for the 1999

World Cup in England. The same year, Bangladesh were granted the one-day status along with ICC Trophy runners-up Kenya.

Its previous attempt for full membership of ICC fell flat thanks to denial by Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and England although India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and West Indies had supported the bid.

Jubilant Bangladeshi expatriates, who gathered in front of the Lord's carrying national flags and placards, burst into cheers when BCB President Saber Chowdhury came out of the meeting and disclosed the ICC decision to grant full membership.

"This is the victory of the nation under the leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina... We are delighted and honoured to have the Test status," said the BCB boss.

Mori's coalition back to power

TOKYO, June 26: The knives came out in Japan today after Prime Minister Yoshiro Mori's ruling alliance scraped back into power with a vastly-reduced parliamentary majority, reports AFP.

Mori's Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) lost its own majority in the 480-seat lower house and was left clinging to power only with the help of its two coalition allies.

The main opposition Democratic Party of Japan made big inroads at the expense of the LDP, which has ruled Japan with only one 10-month break since its formation in 1955.

"It is in effect a loss for the LDP," said a withering editorial in the Asahi Shimbun.

"LDP gets wake-up call," blared the Mainichi Shimbun.

But the stocky 62-year-old prime minister, whose verbal gaffes became a critical issue in Sunday's vote, was safe in his job for now, top party officials said.

"I think it is only natural that I have all the responsibility," Mori told a news conference.

But the prime minister said he would meet with leaders of his two alliance partners later in the day before deciding when to recall parliament, expected to be on July 4, and selecting a new Cabinet.

Mori said he wanted to retain Finance Minister Kiichi Miyazawa and Foreign Minister Yohei Kono to help out with July 21-23 Group of Eight summit in the southern island of Okinawa.

Shimul discloses names of 7 'godfathers'

KHULNA, June 26: Arrested leader of the outlawed PBCP Mahmud Hasan Shimul has named seven persons as his 'godfathers' who sheltered him during his 'underground life.'

They are SP of Khulna Ataul Gani Badsha, his close relative Ward Commissioner Asaduzzaman Litu, a BNP leader, a businessman and three Awami League and Jibno League leaders, said police sources quoting Shimul's confessional statement to a three-member special team.

The special team submitted its report to IGP Nurul Huda on Thursday and it contains names of these 'godfathers' and 'custodians' of Shimul's

government last year.

Badsha was the OC of Khulna thana in 1974.

The seven 'godfathers' of Shimul know what he has disclosed to police and none of them is absconding, a police official said seeking anonymity.

Security inspector commits suicide in Chittagong
