Student communities should be reorganised to save country: Speakers

The student communities should be reorganised to save the country and student politics from the grip of those who are destroying it, speakers said during the inaugural session of National Student Conference-2000 of Jogajog Chhatra Prokria yesterday.

Dr Kamal Hossain was the chief guest at the conference held at the Engineers' Institute auditorium. Presided over by Abu Saleh Mohammad Sayem, it was also attended by prominent economist Dr Mozaffar Ahmed, executive director of Democracy Watch, Taleya Rehman and Dr Abdul Latif Mallik.

Praising the role of students during the historical movements before and after independence, Kamal Hossain said

that the educational institutes are today occupied by terrorists and extortions that make up the present so called student politics.

"I wait for that day when the sacred soil of Dhaka University will become free from the grip of terrorists and those teachers who give them shelter," Kamal Hossain said. He demanded legal steps to free the university from these evil forces.

Taleya Rehman called for coordination between education and employment. She also said that old syllabus should be updated.

The student organisations should not act as 'puppets' of different political groups, Taleya Rehman, said, adding that leaders are not supposed to use students for their personal interests.

Students should introduce a positive trend in politics, Taleya Rehman urged the students, calling on them to avoid the current trend of student politics in the country.

The government has to arrange job opportunities for the young generation and provide facilities to them to become self-reliant, she added.

Dr Mozaffar Ahmed said students should be conscious about their fundamental rights. "I feel ashamed when I see that students demanding postponement of their examinations," he said.

Appreciating the goals mentioned in the declaration of the conference, Dr Ahmed said this spirit has to be spread among that percentage of the students who are not playing an active role in student politics.

US envoy makes farewell call on Rafiq

Outgoing US Ambassador John C Holzman yesterday made a farewell call on State Minister for Energy and Mineral Resources Prof Rafiqul Islam at his parliament office here, reports BSS.

They discussed matters relating to different aspects of mutual interest of the two countries and expressed similar hope that the existing bilateral relations between the two countries would be further strengthened in the years to come.

Prof Islam said the US investment in Bangladesh particularly in the energy sector and the prospects of additional huge investment in the country will have to strengthen the economic ties between Bangladesh and USA.

He said the country expected to receive continued US government support in all areas of development especially in the energy sector.

Natural disasters killed over 70,000 worldwide last year: Report

Hold at BDRCS's headquarters in Dhaka, the launching ceremony was attended by head of IFRC delegation Bob McFerrin, acting chairman of BDRCS Munir Hossain Khan and secretary general Major (retd) Ali Hassan Quoreshi.

The report said that about 150 million people died of AIDS, TB and malaria against 23 million from war between 1945-1993.

Global military spending during this period was 864 bil-

lion dollar whereas only 15 billion dollar was spent to control those deadly diseases, it added.

The report observed that most of the 13 million deaths in 1999 from infectious diseases could have been prevented by spending only 5 dollar for each person.

It pointed out that public expenditure on health in the low-income countries is one per cent of GDP compared to six per cent in the developed countries.

Describing the theme of the report, Bob McFerrin said that

this year the focus has been on public health.

He said that the public health sector must improve its services in vulnerable areas. "That is why, there is a need to share more information," he said.

Referring to WHO report, Ali Hassan Quoreshi said that the country has about 100 cases of AIDS and 20,000 people are HIV positive. BDRCS plans to take up a project to present spread of AIDS, he added.


