

Pepsi-BCB concert June 30

Pepsi and BCB are staging a concert on June 30 to celebrate Bangladesh's elevation to the Test club. This is the first concert to be held at the Bangabandhu National Stadium. The event featuring three bands — Miles, LRB and Nagar Baul — will begin at 7.30 pm, says a press release.

The estimated attendance for the concert is 30,000. Admission is by invitation only. Pepsi is issuing passes for this

purpose. The passes will be distributed through the 74 clubs that are affiliated with the BCB and a promotional campaign conducted by Pepsi.

In the promotional campaign, one pass will be given in exchange for a Pepsi 500ml PET crown at selected retail outlets.

The concert will be a grand gala event featuring musical presentations, fireworks and 75,000 watts of sound.

For The World Bank-Financed Project: "Development of Accounting and Auditing Standards in Bangladesh"

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Bangladesh (ICAB) received a grant from The World Bank under the Project: "Development of Accounting and Auditing Standards in Bangladesh" which will be implemented within a 2-year period.

The key output of the grant is likely to be an enhanced institutional capacity for training on accounting and auditing standards and disclosure requirements in the financial statements of enterprises operating in Bangladesh. Through training courses, workshops, seminars, case studies and publication of relevant papers, International Accounting Standards (IAS), International Standards on Auditing (ISA) and corporate disclosure standards will be disseminated to about 800 participants. A survey of the published accounts will be conducted and weaknesses will be identified and disseminated through the training courses. Besides, a Consultant will be appointed for the preparation of a long-run Strategic Plan for the development of Accounting Profession to keep it compatible to serve for the fast growing global needs.

In order to attain the objectives, ICAB will appoint the following consultants and supporting manpower in addition to those appointed earlier:

1. Strategic Planning Consultant (one)

The Strategic Planning Consultant would be required to:

- Review:
 - Corporate governance structure in Bangladesh;
 - Institutional policy governing accountancy practice in Bangladesh including quality control;
 - Government policies concerning the accountancy profession to ensure professional independence;
 - Existing accountancy professional education system;
- Make recommendations and prepare a Strategic Plan for development of the accountancy profession in Bangladesh; and
- Present the Strategic Plan and observations in Regional Workshops.

This is a Part-time Job for 06 man-months. Remuneration will be US\$ 1200 per man-month. Candidate(s) should be Chartered Accountant(s) having minimum of 6 (six) years' post-qualification experience or any other experts with adequate research backgrounds in Accounting, Finance and related fields. Relevant experience will be an added advantage, preferably with exposure on institutional development of ICAB or similar organizations.

2. Course Consultant (four)

The Course Consultant would be required to:

- Prepare training/workshop materials on International Accounting Standards (IAS), International Standards on Auditing (ISA) and corporate disclosure standards;

- Coordinate & conduct training courses and workshops.

Restoration of voting rights biggest success of AL: Hasina

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said yesterday that the present government's biggest success was the restoration of the voting rights of the people, reports BSS.

"The slogan — I will cast my own vote according to my choice — is now well established in society," the prime minister told Channel i, a private satellite TV, in an exclusive interview Tuesday night.

Sheikh Hasina said, "We have made the people aware of their voting rights and restored their voting and constitutional rights."

The prime minister said democracy was the key to the socio-economic development. She said the people's participation in the state power could not be established without ensuring accountability and transparency of the government. Such process could only be guaranteed by ensuring people's voting rights and changing the government through elections.

When asked how the flow of development had started, the prime minister said the present government had reached the farmers agricultural loan, fertilizer and improved varieties of seed and taken the appropriate steps for irrigation and electric supply. Besides, we have en-

sured fair prices which encouraged the farmers and crop production has increased which resulted in revolution in the agricultural sector.

She expressed her happiness that 2.50 crore metric tons of food could be produced this year. As a result, there was no food deficit this year, she said. "It is a great success which never happened in the history of Bangladesh," the prime minister said adding but the present government started with a deficit of 45 lakh metric tons of food.

Regarding the empowerment of women the prime minister said as a woman she herself always tried to improve the quality of life of the women folk in society to make their lives meaningful and enhance prestige. With this end in view, the present government adopted a policy for the development of women community and made it effective, she said adding, "We tried to make the women community self-reliant educationally and economically as we believe that half of the population of the country is women. So, she said, the national development could not be achieved keeping them neglected."

The Prime Minister said

steps had been taken to involve the women community from the grassroots level in political, economic and development arenas.

The Prime Minister in her interview with the private channel gave a resume of the immense contribution of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in emancipating the Bangalee nation to the younger generation who did not witness the War of Liberation.

She said, "We had gone through long struggle and shed blood through supreme sacrifices to wrest our independence. We have fought for 24 long years under the leadership of Bangabandhu. After 1975 the nation was not allowed to know about this immense sacrifice rather the history of the victory was described in a distorted way."

She said the present government after coming to power had taken steps to project the real history of independence, spirit of the War of Liberation, sacrifice of Bangabandhu and victory Bangalee nation.

The prime minister called upon all to come forward to work for projecting the real history of the brave Bangalee nation.

Women's reserved seats

NCBPR expresses concern over bill placed in parliament

National Committee for Beijing Plus Five Review (NCBPR) has voiced concern over the placing of a bill that seeks to have 30 seats reserved for women in Parliament for the next 10 years, reports UNB.

In a statement yesterday, NCBPR has said that the Law Minister submitted the bill ignoring the national demand for increased seats for women and direct election to these seats.

It also pointed out that the bill has been placed at the JS at a time when Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is determined to empower women in the greater interest of national development.

NCBPR called for placing a fresh bill that will seek direct election of women to parliament and increase in number of seats for them.

Community policing system to be introduced: Nasim

Home Minister Mohammad Nasim yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that the government has a plan to introduce community policing system to oversee law and order all over the country, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from Haji Mohammad Selim of Awami League, the minister said the concerned unit chiefs have already undertaken effective measures to materialise this plan in 64 districts including the metropolitan areas.

As a result, the minister said, it has been possible to launch the community policing system at the district headquarters units with success side by side creating awareness among the general mass about this sys-

tem. To another question from Jafrul Islam Chowdhury of BNP from Chittagong, the Home Minister said the government has a plan to set up a fire service and civil defence station at each upazila headquarters.

When BNP's Sarwar Jamal Nizam from Chittagong sought to know about the highway police and petrol car supply, Mohammad Nasim said the government was now increasing the number of highway police as part of its plan to ensure safety and security on this important communication network.

He said at least 11 patrol cars were now being used on the highways besides the supply of pick-ups to 59 highway police camps. "The government will provide in phases a highway patrol car for each of the 64 districts," he added.

Replying to another question from M Mustafizur Rahman (Fizu), the home minister said the construction of the Central Jail at Kashimpur under Gazipur district was now going on.

The approved Project Profile (PP) of the new central jail provides for its completion during the fiscal year 2001-2002 subject to the allocation of money in the Annual Development Plan (ADP), he said.

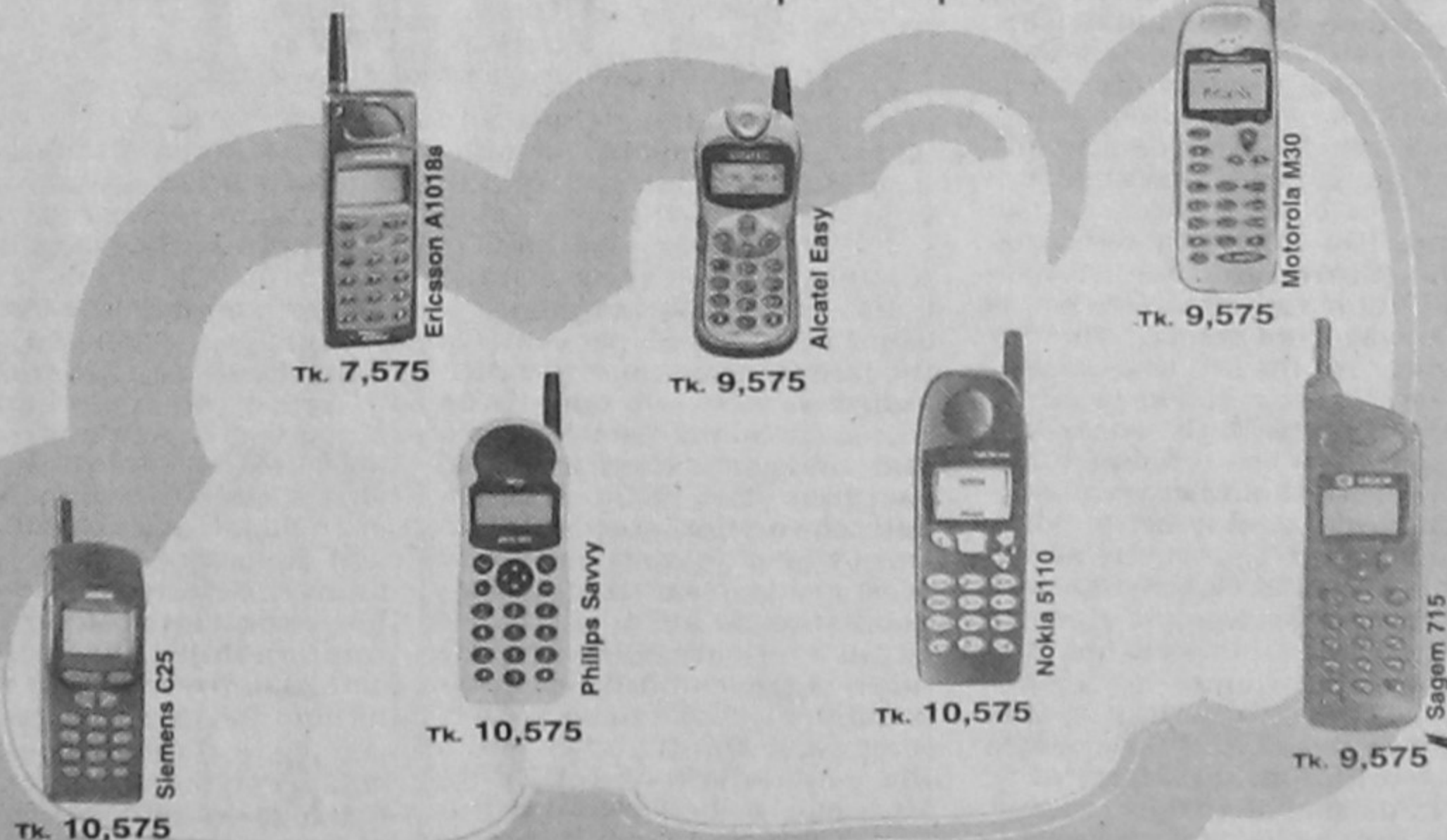
