### Bangladeshi shot dead by BSF

From Staff Correspondent SYLHET, July 10: A Bangladesh national was shot dead by the BSF men at Sripur border this morning.

BDR has lodged protest with BSF for the killing and asked for the body. But the body was not handed over to the Bangladesh authority, sources

Sirajuddin, a stone quarry labourer along with another man went to the Rangpani area of Sripur Stone quarry near the border at about 8 am today. He was shot dead as the BSF men of the nearby BOP opened fire without any provocation. The BSF men also took away the body to the Indian territory, sources said. The killing sparked tense in the stone quarry area suspending the stone collection

The BDR lodged a protest and asked for the body at a flag meeting with the BSF in the afternoon.




