

However, the 'classical' Dengue virus does not cause much harm but the Dengue Haemorrhagic Fever (DHF) is fatal. Both the viruses are carried by Aedes Eegypti

> mosquito" He added, "Aedes Eegypti mosquito can fly a maximum distance of 50 yards. Once it bites humans, the virus incubates in the blood for 5-7 days. Typically, dengue is characterised by high fever that persists for a couple of days. The infection, particularly in children, causes rash in some parts

of the body." According to WHO, worldwide cases of Dengue infection

WHO described the Dengue outburst as 'explosive.' An estimated 500,000 patients with DHF infection are hospitalised every year. A very large number of them are children, and roughly five per cent of the total

is caused by four types of viruses, carried by mosquito. Aedes Aegypti mosquito carries one of the viruses in tropical countries like Bangladesh, experts said.
