

# Big challenges before agriculture

Minister backs suggestion for land reclamation in coastal belt

By Staff Correspondent

Agriculture Minister Motia Fast depletion of croplands, Chowdhury, former ministers M Majid-ul Haq, M Syeduzzaman, AMA Muhit and a host of experts, agriculturists, and representatives from private and country's agriculture today. NGO sectors also took part.

The agriculture minister strongly supported the keynote presenter's suggestion for land reclamation in the large coastal

"We've to convince the donors to invest in land reclamation for if we want to survive in the future when we won't be able to grow enough food to feed the large population due to Dr. Mahabub Hossain, Head acute land shortage," said Mo-

> She however differed with the keynote speaker on the point of providing subsidy to agriculture.

As Hossain argued in favour of channeling resources saved from subsidy cuts to rural infrastructure development, Motia said the government's farm subsidy is already quite low.

She came down heavily on the diehard supporters of market economy, saying "If developing economies can provide huge price incentives to the farmers without earning any bad name for market distortion, why should it not be so in case of Bangladesh.

On the issue of further market opening for private seed merchants, the minister said "the market is already wide open for the private sector to do and preparation of an agriculbusiness in seed sector except- tural growth strategy containing some restrictions in trade of cereal seeds."

Motia however was equally critical of activities of some of the NGOs and private sector organisations. "The government has to see the interests of the

poor farmers as and when they fall prey to substandard seed marketing.

Earlier, Dr. Hossain in his paper emphasised sustaining quality of the soil and water resources with the growing pressure for intensification of farming. He mentioned that cropping intensity has already exceeded 175 per cent, one of the highest in the world.

Hossain argued for more public sector investment in agricultural research. He also touched upon the issues of crop diversification, land reforms ing strong elements to promote fish and livestock production.

Former agriculture minister M Majid-ul Haq expressed concern at the loss of soil fertility and blamed it on excessive use See page 11 col 6

Addressing a big public meeting at A R High School ground, she said the Jamaat -Shibir killers unleashed terrorism and massacre in Chittagong gunning down nine students and a scooter driver on July 12. They committed genocide in

1971 and again massacred ten people, including nine BCL activists in Chittagong on July

The Shibir gunmen let loose
