"It is now one year and 10 months to go until the kickoff of the 2002 FIFA World Cup Korea/Japan, the first World Cup ever to be held in Asia and the first to be co-hosted," Yasuhiko Endoh, general secretary of the Japan organising committee

"Preparations in both Korea and Japan are going smoothly. exceeding our hopes," he said at the ongoing China Football 2000 exhibition. Three of the 10 new Japanese

stadiums have been completed. while the seven other stadiums look like being completed on schedule, he said. Park Seh-Jik, head of South Korea's 2002 World Cup Organ-

ising Committee, stepped down "I am resigning from my post by respecting the wishes of the sovereign and to help the coun-

try stage the World Cup successfully." Park said in a statement. The committee said Park's retirement ceremony would be held on August 8. Committee officials said Park's successor

should be named within two months after his resignation. Park, who was re-elected for

a three-year term in January, had had a fraught relationship with South Korea's football association chairman. Chung Mong-Joon, and Culture Tourism Minister Park Jie-Won.

Park Jie-Won, a confidant of President Kim Dae-Jung, has demanded the dismissal of Park Seh-Jik for what he called the committee's lacklustre activities.
