

**South Africa strikes it rich**

JOHANNESBURG, July 29: South African cricket managed to emerge from the scandal-ridden 1999-2000 season with a profit of around 24 million rand (3.46 million dollars), the United Cricket Board of South Africa (UCBSA) announced Saturday, reports AFP.

Speaking at the board's annual meeting here, newly-elected president Percy Sonn described the past year as an "annus horribilis" for South African cricket, due to match-fixing allegations involving former skipper Hansie Cronje and three other players.

Sonn told the meeting South African cricket would have to work hard to win back the public trust lost through the scandal.

The way to do this, he said, was to ensure that the senior side's standard remained among the highest in the world, to continue to widen the base of the game in the country, to deepen the transformation process and to rally together for World Cup 2003, which is to be held in South Africa.

In his financial report, treasurer John Blair said that because of the Cronje scandal, the years leading up to World Cup 2003 could be "pretty lean" financially.

For this reason, he added, the UCBSA intended holding on to a large proportion of its revenue.

Retired judge Edwin King is currently holding a commission of inquiry into South African cricket following Cronje's admission in April that he had accepted money for forecasting.

The confession, which led to his sacking and stunned the cricketing world, came after Indian police claimed Cronje and three of his teammates were involved in fixing one-day matches during South Africa's tour of the sub-continent in February and March.

Cronje expanded on his admission when he gave evidence to the commission but has insisted he was never involved in match-fixing.

The publicity-happy NSC meanwhile says that an exclusive cricket stadium in Fatullah is nearing completion and should be ready for action by next month.

The oval-shaped 25,000-seater ground in Narayanganj, however, is a fair distance from the capital. In order to make it worthwhile, several link roads are being constructed.

But observers believe that although on paper everything is in the order, in reality the venue won't be ready for international events in five years.

An ambitious Sabar Hossain Chowdhury, the president of the cricket board, is very keen to see Bangladesh play host to the 2011 World Cup. There is nothing wrong with such a notion since the cricket-loving country has benefited from staging several high-profile events - the first-ever ICC Knock-out Tournament, Asian Test Championship final, the Cricket Week all-star match and the Asia Cup.

What cricket has always lacked in political clout is more than made up through its dogged determination. The credit for a turnaround in its fortunes must go to the BCB president.

To the contrary, football organisers did nothing at all in past few years for the betterment of the game. They become hyperactive only when they need to oust cricket out of the BNS. The BFF is being run by such a chief, who had never felt to visit his stadium office more than ten times in his four-year tenure now.

For many years chess was regarded as a game that had great potential. Yes, it did unearth a genius named Niaz Murshed, the first Grand Master from the subcontinent. But due to the organisational shortsightedness and the dubious stand of NSC it could not rise in stature. Now cricket has been placed on a pedestal and should not be allowed to slip into the same abyss.

**S Korea, Chinese Taipei in final**

Defending champions South Korea and Chinese Taipei moved into the final of the Soya America Sixth Asian Women Juniors Handball Championship by defeating their respective rivals in the semifinals yesterday, reports UNB.

South Korea outplayed Japan 33-14 in the first semifinal at the Mirpur Shaheed Suhrawardi National Indoor Stadium.

South Korea will play Chinese Taipei in the final of the seven-nation meet on Monday at 5 pm while two losing semifinalists - China and Japan - will battle for third place the same day at 3.30 pm.

Top three teams of the meet will qualify for the World Women Juniors Handball Championship to be held in Hungary on July 29-August 12 next year.

The two sub-continent rivals - hosts Bangladesh and neighboring India - will meet each other in a fifth place-deciding match today at 4.05 pm.

Five-time champions South Korea dominated the first session 17-6.

Choi In Jeong of the winners, who scored five goals, was

adjudged CUTE-player-of-the-match for her outstanding performance.

Kim Eun Jung contributed nine, Moon Oil Hee seven, Lee Seul Hee four for the winners while Ota Yoyoi made four, Okazaki Miki and Tomita Takako scored three each for the losers.

The strongly built Korean squad, with a huge jubilant supporters cheering them up from the gallery, deserved the comfortable victory as they outplayed the Japanese in all departments.

In the other semifinal, Chinese Taipei made a surprise entry into the final at the expense of last time runners-up China.

They shocked their opponents 25-22.

Chinese Taipei custodian Chen Hsiao Chi, who did an excellent job under the bar, was named as CUTE-player-of-the-match.

Lai Wan Yu scored six goals, Chu Chiu En five, Lee Hsiu Wei four for the winners while Li Wei of the losing side highest ten goals. Besides Zhu Lili and Ji Xiao Fang netted three each.

**Blatter for a fresh outlook**

LONDON, July 29: FIFA president Sepp Blatter will instigate a wide-ranging discussion into the World Cup bidding process at the executive meeting of the world governing body in Zurich on August 3, the Press Association reported on Friday, says AFP.

The South Africans have already requested that Germany's victory in the race to host the 2006 event should be examined by an arbitration panel.

A decision on that issue will be made by FIFA general secretary Michel Zen-Ruffinen next week.

However, Blatter, in his monthly editorial comment in the official FIFA magazine 'Goal', wants the whole process to be looked at to see if modifications can be made.

"This should not in any way diminish the achievement of the German bidders in attaining the success they had sought with a prolonged and highly convincing campaign that combined characteristic German thoroughness with style and imagination," said Blatter.

"Rather, the discussion is intended to be a first airing of views on how the established system may be modified to meet

even the most exacting demands of equal opportunity and transparency."

Blatter is continuing to press his desire for an automatic rotation system for future World Cups, an idea, which has the backing of UEFA.

However, the debate will have no bearing on Zen-Ruffinen's investigation into the South African claims.

The Swiss lawyer must consider the legal implications of the decision before announcing how he intends to deal with the

matter.

Confusion over the issue had arisen because of comments made in China last night by FIFA development division director Walter Gagg.

"The decision is final," claimed Gagg, "any alteration to the outcome is not possible."

However, although Gagg was in Beijing on behalf of FIFA president Sepp Blatter, he is not one of the 24-man voting panel who confirmed Germany as the hosts of the 2006 event and does not have the power to decide how the issue will be resolved.

South Africa contend that the final 12-11 outcome in Germany's favour should not be allowed to stand because Oceania delegate Charles Dempsey was mandated to vote for South Africa, but instead controversially abstained claiming he was put "under intolerable pressure" by unnamed figures on the fringe of the bidding process.

"We should not create any impression that this particular legislation is in urgent need of repair," said Blatter.

"The purpose of the debate will not be to call into question a voting procedure that had been observed scrupulously, under the vigilant eye of a public notary and to the full satisfaction of all those present in the committee room."

**Porto bail Bai out**

LISBON, July 29: FC Porto are set to sign Portuguese international keeper Vitor Baia, loaned out to the club last year from Barcelona as the Catalan giants have not renewed his contract, the Jornal de Noticias said Friday, reports AFP.

"I am currently negotiating to rescind my contract with Barcelona and the resolution of my case is imminent," said Baia, 30, who started his career with Porto before spending three seasons at Barca until he lost his first team slot to Dutchman Ruud Hesp.

**Valderrama wants to come back**

BOGOTA, July 29: Former Colombia captain Carlos Valderrama is considering an international comeback at the age of 38 because he says he is shocked by the team's lacklustre performances without him, reports Reuters.

"I'm thinking of coming back because the way we are playing gives me pain and makes me sad," he told Caracol radio on Thursday. "It's something I'll have to have a good think about." "I watch the teams and it makes me want to be on the pitch," added the midfielder, who has been seeing out his career in Major League Soccer in the United States.

Valderrama played for Colombia at three World Cups, although he failed to live up to his reputation at any, before announcing his international retirement after France in 1998.

Colombia coach Luis Augusto Garcia has been struggling to rebuild the team after asper-legged striker Faustino Asprilla and key midfielder Freddy Rincou, who has also played three World Cups, both refused to continue playing for their country.

**Zenden deal hits a snag**

BARCELONA, July 29: Dutch international winger Boude wijn Zenden admitted on Friday that his transfer from Barcelona to Lazio has stalled, reports Reuters.

The two clubs had appeared to have reached agreement over a transfer fee of 2,150 million pesetas (11.9 million dollars) two weeks ago but Zenden, one of the stars of Euro 2000, put the blame on Lazio for failing to complete the deal.

"We are going to have to return to the negotiating table but I hope to have a solution in the coming days," Zenden said.

Zenden had expected to be on his way to Rome by now but instead he is training alone at the Nou Camp because the rest of the Barcelona first team squad is in the Netherlands training and playing some pre-season friendlies.

**Ronaldo's tax affairs to be examined**

RIO DE JANEIRO, July 29: Brazilian federal police have asked officials in the southwestern state of Foz de Iguazu to investigate the tax affairs of Inter Milan star Ronaldo, on suspicion of tax evasion, police said here Friday, reports AFP.

The allegation goes back to last summer, following the Brazilian squad's return from the Copa America in Paraguay.

Police inspector Jesse Ferry told AFP that the investigation followed the discovery of apparent "discrepancies in declarations made by the owner of a shop in the Paraguayan resort of Ciudad del Este, those of the player himself and information published by the press at the time."

According to Ferry, the investigation is based on tape recordings, articles and photographs published in the press at the time which claimed that Ronaldo had come home with 10,000 dollars worth of goods which he then allegedly did not declare at customs on return to Brazil.

The owner of the shop told police Ronaldo had bought nothing but had made enquiries about several items, including a 5,000 dollar Cartier watch.

Ronaldo told the police he bought a watch for 130 dollars, which he gave to his physio-therapist - perfectly legal as the local legal limit for such gifts is 150 dollars.

Nonetheless the police want Ronaldo's account to be investigated as "the law also applies to powerful people."

A spokesman for Ronaldo said he did not wish to comment and that "he has other more important problems to deal with."

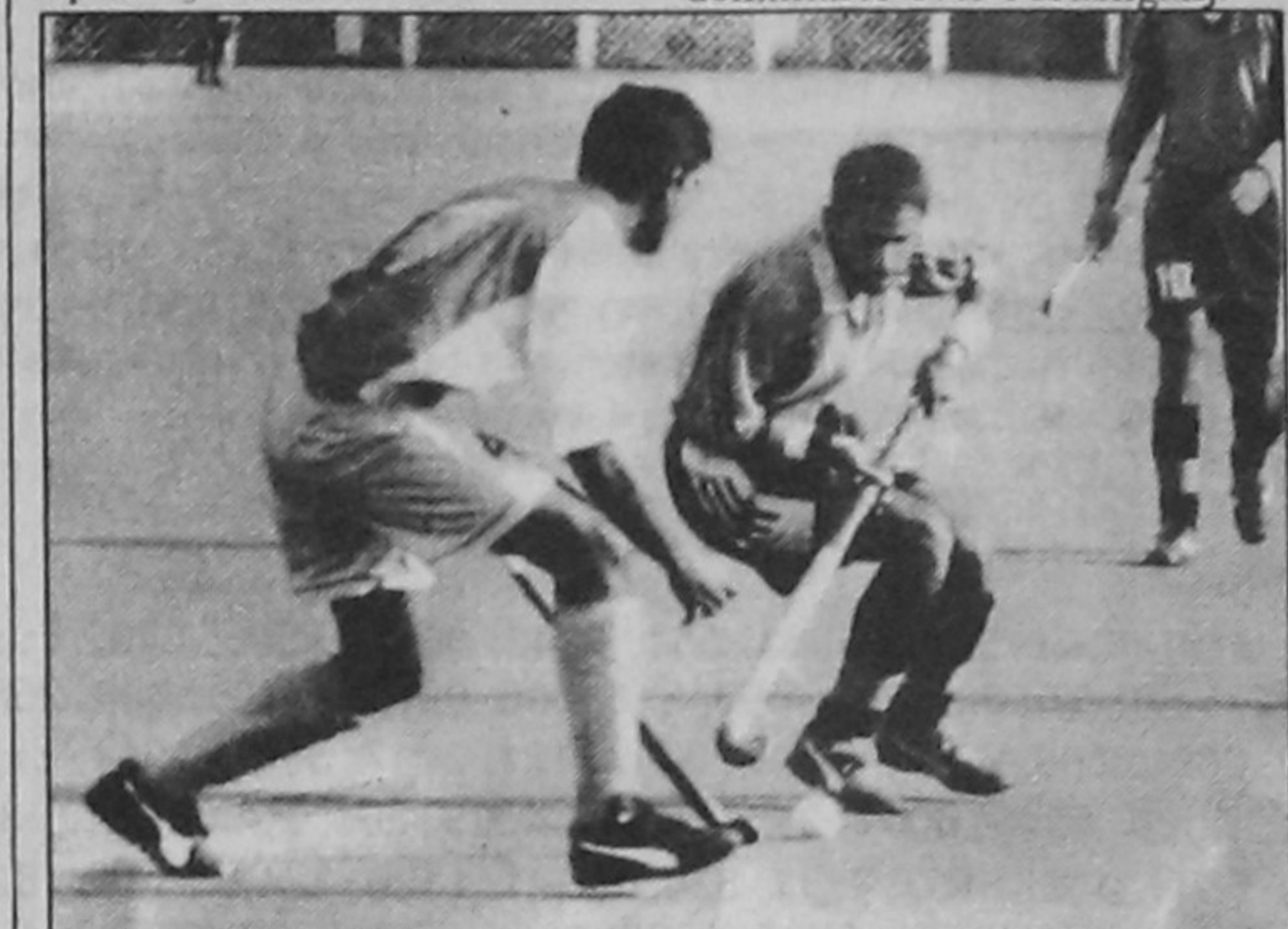
**Mariner men stunned**

**Sun shines on PSG, OM**

PARIS, July 29: Olympique Marseille beat Troyes 3-1 for a triumphant start to their season on Friday in contrast to their miserable 1999/2000 campaign and Paris Saint Germain won by the same scoreline against Strasbourg, reports AFP.

This opening day of the French League championship was a boost to both top clubs who, with Monaco and Bordeaux, are perennial title challengers.

Florian Maurice from the spot, William Gallas and new signing Adriano of Brazil all got on the scoresheet to the delight of new Brazilian coach Abel Braga. Samuel Bouel found the net for Troyes's goal.

Paris Saint Germain, last year's runners-up, got their campaign on the road with goals from Brazil's Christian, a Yannick Fischer own goal, and Laurent Robert. Strasbourg's Yugoslavian Danijel Ljuboja hit their consolation strike.

In the ninth minute, Troyes keeper Tony Heurtelbis ventured recklessly off his line and, hampered by Klas Ingegnon, lost the ball on the left side and

Djamel Belnadi centred for Maurice who was illegally floored by Pascal Renier.

Maurice made no mistake from the spot to put Marseille ahead.

Troyes, having trouble finding their mark in midfield, nevertheless hit back in the 21st minute.

A Fabio Celestini corner on the left found the head of Boual who scored at the near post while Marseille were reduced to 10 men with defender Patrick Blondeau nursing his right foot on the touchline.

This goal shocked Marseille who took time to regroup. Yugoslavian Sladjan Djukic, on his own in front of Marseille keeper Stephane Trevisan three minutes from the break, managed to miscue a half volley attempt.

Marseille kept their heads up however and William Gallas managed to get past the Troyes defence to knock home a free kick from the left by Jerome Leroy in the 45th minute.

After the break, the game became a tame affair with only two shots, by Troyes players Celestini and Mehdi Meniri and which failed to find the target in the final 10 minutes, causing

a stir in the Stade Velodrome.

Then in injury time, Adriano, set up by Jacques Abardonado, rifled home spectacularly after running to the right and hitting in the opposite direction to give greater weight to the scoreline.

Meanwhile Meniri earned his second yellow card to be sent off in the final minute.

Stephane Dalmat, signed from Marseille, had a chance in the opening spell but fired into the side netting of Strasbourg keeper Thierry Debess.

Strasbourg however scored first through Ljuboja from a corner on the left by Stephane Roda in the 24th minute.

**Chang, Gambill on a roll**

LOS ANGELES, July 29: Fourth-seeded Michael Chang, at fourth the highest seed remaining, defeated South African Wayne Ferreira and sixth-seeded Jan-Michael Gambill beat Australian Jason Stoltenberg to gain semifinal berths at the snake-bitten 375,000 dollars Los Angeles Open, reports Reuters.

In search of his first ATP Tour title since 1998, Chang outslugged fifth-seeded Ferreira from the baseline for a 6-3, 7-6 (9-7) victory to set up a showdown against fellow American Justin Gimelstob.

Gambill, meanwhile, got a break when Stoltenberg double-faulted away the fourth game of the final set en route to a 6-1, 3-6, 6-1 victory.

"This week in LA is very very uncommon," Chang said about the injury-ravaged tournament. "We hope that it never happens. It's obviously very tough on the tournament."

But not on Chang. The 1996 titleholder and three-time finalist in Los Angeles improved to 7-0 lifetime against Ferreira in the 85-minute win to claim his fifth semifinal of the year and set up his first-ever meeting with hard-serving Gimelstob.

Earlier, Gimelstob, the hometown favourite, got through to his first semifinal of the year when countryman Paul Goldstein was forced to default with tendinitis in his left foot, trailing 3-0 after 11 minutes.
