

Bangladesh Sugar Mills workers observe token hunger strike

Bangladesh Sugar Mills Workers and Employees Federation observed a token hunger strike yesterday demanding implementation of their three-point demand.

The federation at first tried to observe the strike in front of the National Press Club but following police interruption had to shift to Muktangan in the city.

The strike was observed from 11 am to 6 pm. The federation leaders who addressed the workers and employees on strike included Muazidul Islam, Ataur Rahman, SM Kibria, Jahidul Islam Latif and Moza

har Ali.

The leaders declared a five day agitation programme including a day long strike at all sugar mills on August 20, and an indefinite strike from August 27 if their demands were not met.

Besides they will also observe a token work abstention programme at the office and factory on August 12, 13, and 14.

Their three-point demand are: immediate declaration of wage commission award, removal of discrepancy between wage commission and salary and stoppage of selling shares of sugar mills.
