Warne, 30, has held the leadership role since early last year but despite being one of the greatest players of all time he has come under scrutiny following a recent controversy in England.

The married father of two admitted having intimate telephone conversations with an English nurse during his stint for county side Hampshire, angering officials as cricket struggles to project a respectable image in the face of the match-fix-

ing storm. Warne though has the support of national selectors and past Australian captains such as Mark Taylor and Allan Border who see no reason to replace him with either batsman Ricky Ponting or wicketkeeper Adam | to 73 for three in the 37.3 overs
