

### Sotomayor cleared

MONACO, Aug 3: World high jump record holder Javier Sotomayor was cleared to compete in next month's Sydney Olympics yesterday when the International Amateur Athletic Federation decided to lift his two-year ban for taking cocaine, reports Reuters.

A special meeting of the IAAF's ruling council decided on humanitarian grounds to reinstate the 1992 Barcelona Olympic champion after a plea from Cuban council member Alberto Juantorena.

After the council had met for 10 hours in an effort to clear up its outstanding doping cases before the Sydney Games, IAAF president Lamine Diack said that Sotomayor had passed 300 tests in his career.

"We thought this athlete deserved a lot of support," Diack said. "We said we can give him the possibility to compete again. He is a human being, he made a mistake."

Sotomayor, 32, tested positive at the Pan-American Games in Winnipeg, Canada, in August last year. He denied taking the recreational stimulant and was cleared by his national federation.

The decision was over-ruled by the IAAF's arbitration panel and then in turn overturned at an emergency one-day council meeting convened yesterday to clear up remaining doping cases before the Olympics.

In other decisions Dieter Baumann, the Barcelona 5,000 metres champion, had his positive test for nandrolone referred to arbitration while Linford Christie, who won the Olympic 100 metres title in the same year, will have his nandrolone case heard by the panel on August 14.

### Sampras made to sweat

TORONTO, Aug 3: The fall of the seeds at the 2.95-million-dollar ATP tournament here continued on Wednesday with French Open champion Gustavo Kuerten losing at the hands of Canadian Sebastien Lareau 7-6 (7/4), 6-4, reports AFP.

The fourth-seeded Brazilian, who lost in the second round, joined third-seeded Magnus Norman of Sweden and top seeded American Andre Agassi on the scrapheap of this event.

Wimbledon winner Pete Sampras, the second seed, barely avoided joining the exiles, holding off Morocco's Karim Alami 7-6 (7/3), 6-2. Sampras needed a third-set tiebreaker to oust a French qualifier in his first match Tuesday.

"It wasn't easy but after I won the first set he got down on himself. I was able to raise my level up a bit," Sampras said. "Like yesterday, it was a struggle but I feel my game is where I want it to be."

Lareau, a doubles specialist, was ranked just 137th in the world before this tournament. He twice broke Kuerten's serve during the match, a feat his opponent could not manage once.

"I was just so happy," Lareau said. "When you're playing at home, your people are around, family, coaches, everything. It was just a great feeling to get my biggest accomplishment here in Canada."

Lareau had already caused a stir in the first round when he beat 34th world-ranked Fabrice Santoro of France.

"The fact of having two great victories gives me a lot of confidence," Lareau said.

Also ousted was seventh seed Lleyton Hewitt of Australia, who lost to France's Sebastien Grosjean 6-3, 7-6 (7/5).

## French First Division preview

# Sedan test for Lyon



PARIS, Aug 3: The second round of matches in the French Championship got under way Thursday with Champions League hopefuls Lyon facing a tricky visit to Sedan, reports AFP.

Former Paris St Germain and French international goalkeeper Bernard Lama, meanwhile, prepares to face his former club Saturday when Rennes host the early front-runners from Paris.

Two games are slated for Friday with a rematch of the Trophée des Champions two weeks ago between Monaco and Nantes at the Louis II stadium and Marseille visiting St. Etienne before the rest of the matches on Saturday.

Lyon fought back from two goals down against Rennes in their opening match to salvage a draw at home thanks to late strikes from Brazilian star Sonny Anderson and French international Tony Vairelles.

However they cannot afford to let their concentration slip against Sedan although they are sure to have one eye on the Champions League.

They will travel to Slovakia to face Inter Bratislava on Monday in a crucial 3rd round first-leg qualifying match with a place in the lucrative Group phase at stake.

"We must go to Sedan and look for something positive," said Lyon's coach Jacques Santini. "It remains important to respect our opposition and be careful against a team that surprised everyone last season. We also saw what they did against Auxerre (1-0 win away in opening match), he added.

"The message we can take from the game against Rennes is that physically we have the resources," concluded Santini. "Sedan, who only won promotion to the top flight last season after a long absence, were the surprise packages of the last campaign and were even threatening to qualify for the Champions League before settling for a place in the more modest Interotto Cup from which they have now been eliminated."

"It will be the same for us. We'll play our game and try and build on what we did at Auxerre. The important thing is to improve on our build-up in the attacking zone," said Sedan coach Alex Dupont.

Monaco, who were held to a 1-1 draw at newly promoted Lille in their first match as defending champions, host Nantes on Friday two weeks after beating the "Canaries" on penalties in the equivalent of the English Charity Shield match at Sochaux.

Nantes, who have won the French Cup the two previous seasons albeit both times on dubious penalties, will want to embark on a new league campaign looking to avoid their regular battle with relegation although they got off to a disas-

trous start last week when they crashed 2-0 at home to Lens.

The other match on Friday promises to be a passionate affair at St. Etienne as the "Green Devils" host Marseille in the 87th encounter between the French giants.

To date both teams have won 37 times with 12 draws although the same fixture last season at the Geoffroy Guichard stadium saw St. Etienne storm to a 5-1 thrashing of their rivals.

The matches have a history of controversy notably in October 1991 when former French striker Jean-Pierre Papin was struck in the head by a can of beer forcing him to miss the match which St. Etienne went on to win 1-0.

The big game on Saturday sees Paris St. Germain travel to Brittany to face Rennes in what will be an emotional debut match for former PSG stalwart Lina. He was released by the Parisian outfit at the end of last season.

Lama who only resumed training Tuesday with his new club had been linked to a move to Brazil but the 37-year-old originally from Guyana has

signed a two-year-deal and couldn't face a bigger match in his debut for Rennes.

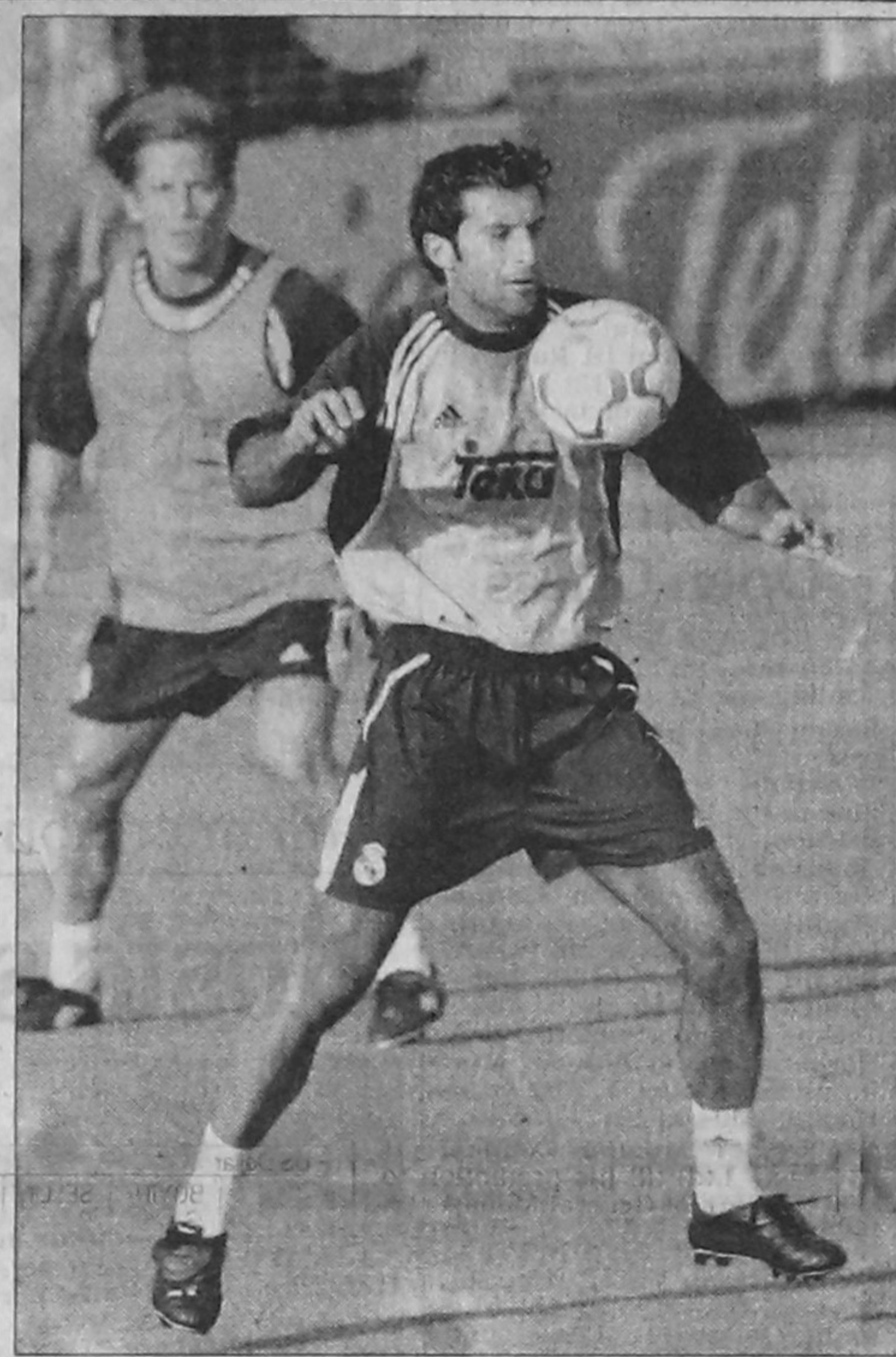
French superstar Nicolas Anelka is still not match fit so coach Philippe Bergeroo will stick with the same attacking formation that he used in the 3-1 opening night victory over Strasbourg that featured Brazilian Christian and Kaba Diawara.

## Euro giants in Munich

MUNICH, Aug 3: The top clubs in European football are in Munich for a gilt-edged mini tournament to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Germany's premier club Bayern Munich, reports AFP.

Bayern have invited European Champions Real Madrid, UEFA Cup holders Galatasaray as well as English champions Manchester United to take part in a pre-season mini tournament.

Only four games will be played in double headers on Friday and Saturday but tantalisingly, Bayern did not draw themselves to play United.

The wounds inflicted by Alex Ferguson's crew in the 1998 Champions League final in Barcelona, when they stole victory with two death knell goals, are still raw at Bayern.

These games will not be taken that seriously though as the four teams are still fine tuning their line ups for their respective domestic seasons.

The tournament will open on Friday with Bayern playing Galatasaray, followed in the evening by Real versus Manchester.

The make up of the final two games scheduled for Saturday will be decided by Friday's results.

**Real to unveil Makelele, Conceicao**

MADRID, Aug 3: European champions Real Madrid will officially present new signings Claude Makelele of France and Brazilian Flavio Conceicao at a press conference Thursday, reports AFP.

The latest signings of midfielder Makelele from Celta Vigo and Conceicao from Primera Liga champions Deportivo La Coruna should put an end to the club's busy pre-season activity in the transfer market.

The transfer fees of the two players have not been disclosed although according to the Spanish press, Deportivo received over 22 million dollars for Conceicao.

The 27-year-old Makelele had been a target for rivals Valencia, who Real beat 3-0 in the Champions League final but turned the club down last week and had spells in the French league with Marseille, Nantes and Brest.

Conceicao 26, had been at Deportivo since 1996 after making his name in the Brazilian First Division with Palmeiras.

**Wolves eye Saudi Blue Fox'**

LONDON, Aug 3: Saudi Arabian international striker Sami Al-Jaber is on trial at Wolves with a view to a possible permanent deal, club officials said, reports AFP.

The 27-year-old, known as 'The Blue Fox' in Saudi Arabia, has played in two World Cup finals for his country and scored 44 international goals in 80 appearances.

Al-Jaber will play for Wolves in Saturday's friendly against Southampton, and Molineux boss Colin Lee said: "He has arrived with a big reputation."

# Fowler promises fireworks



LONDON, Aug 3: Skipper Robbie Fowler claimed on Monday he is starved of glory and hungrier than ever to reclaim his place as the country's most gifted natural goalscorer, reports AFP.

He hopes to start his campaign in Belfast this week with the added responsibility of being Liverpool's new captain, at least until the New Year.

Fowler will lead Liverpool into the Belfast tournament, where they play Clontar on Thursday and Benfica on Saturday, intent on putting behind him the agonies and frustrations of last season's injury nightmare.

And he vowed: "This season you will see the Robbie Fowler you have seen in the past."

While Fowler has been fighting for full fitness these past few months, he has seen 20-million-pounds (about 32-million-dollars) plus of striking options in Emile Heskey, Nicky Barnby and Bernard Diomede added to the already impressive fire-power of Michael Owen and Titi Camara.

He added: "I've always been hungry to get into the team, so it's no different now with such competition around. But I'm hungrier than ever, starving you could say."

Fowler, who brushed aside the now ritual transfer speculation that surrounds him - from Leeds, Middlesbrough, Arsenal and Manchester United this close season - by making it clear he isn't going anywhere, and just wants to be in the starting line-up each week.

He said: "I've no reason to leave. It's just a matter of time before we start winning trophies because Liverpool are going places."

But the memories of so much injury horror have made him that bit keener to start making amends. He started just eight games last season and under-

career so far, so last season was very disappointing. But that can happen in this game and I've just got to get on with it.

"But I'm confident in my ability, and I know what I can do. But I know it's going to be tough after all my injury problems."

"Even though I didn't get a game for England in Euro 2000, I trained with the squad all the time and that must have helped my attempts for full fitness and sharpness."

Fowler, who will be captain until Jamie Redknapp returns around February, relishes the fight he has on his hands, although he added: "I don't think I have to prove anything to anybody."

And it is the competition generated by boss Gerard Houllier's 50million outlay that is inspiring Fowler.

He said: "If you are not playing well then you know you are not going to be playing. That sort of competition keeps everyone on their toes."

"The lads who have come in this summer are determined to impress so it's going to be tough to get yourself back into the side. The competition is beneficial to Liverpool, and that's all that really matters."

He added: "I'm no bigger than anyone else here, and if it happens to me sitting on the bench then you have to accept it because these days it's not all about 11 players, there's 25 top stars here now."

"If I'm not doing my job then the gaffer has every right to leave me sitting on the bench. He'll have every right not to play me."

# India still in Nehru era!



NEW DELHI, Aug 3 (AFP): "It's not the winning, but taking part, that matters," India's first prime minister Jawahar Lal Nehru was fond of saying.

And the country's Olympic athletes certainly seem to have taken his message to heart.

India may be an emerging superpower with a billion people and nuclear weapons. But when it comes to winning Olympic medals, it is a virtual non-entity.

A solitary bronze medal was all the country could manage at Atlanta in 1996 and things do not look like being much better in Sydney.

Tennis and field hockey provide the only hopes of success with the rest of the 60-strong contingent in New Delhi.

The return of former world doubles champions Leander Paes and Mahesh Bhupathy and the recent success of the hockey team will at least ensure that the Games are not a total non-event for Indian fans.

Paes and Bhupathy, who last year achieved the rare feat of playing the doubles finals of all four Grand Slams - they won the French Open and Wimbledon titles - are together again after a bitter year-long feud over Bhupathy's coach Enrico Piperno.

In field hockey, India's pride and joy in years gone by, Dhyanraj Pillay's national squad are buoyant at regaining the Asian Games crown after 32 years and defeating fancied Australia and Germany to the title in a tournament in Perth earlier this year.

India's Olympic record is dismal: Eight hockey golds, all of them before Europe took the sport seriously, and three individual bronze medals.

The last of India's hockey golds came during the western-bycotted Moscow Games in 1980. It's been a downhill plunge since then.

India finished fifth at Los Angeles in 1984, sixth at Seoul, seventh at Barcelona and eighth at Atlanta four years ago.

Paes, a journeyman on the ATP circuit but a self-confessed Davis Cup addict, saved India's campaign at the Atlanta Olympics by winning a bronze in the men's singles.

It was India's first individual medal since wrestler K.D. Jadhav's bronze in the 1956 Melbourne Games and came 96 years after Norman Pritchard won a silver in the 200 metres at Paris in 1900.

Indian Olympic Association president Suresh Kalmadi admitted the prospects for Sydney are bleak.

"We hope to win medals in

hockey and tennis only and expect our boxers and women weightlifters to at least reach the quarterfinals," he said.

"The aim is to win respect before the next two Olympics."

Amrit Mathur, a senior bureaucrat in the government-run Sports Authority of India, says the country's lack of success in the sporting arena is no surprise.

"Sports holds a low priority in an Indian's life," Mathur said. "The emphasis is on studies and securing a decent job, not on running about on playing fields."

"And even if someone takes sport seriously, he does not have the support of modern facilities and training which is available in China and Australia."

Mathur, whose organisation oversees the maintenance of various stadiums around the country, says he is forced to hire out venues to pop concerts to raise money in the absence of sporting activity.

## Chelsea give up on Casiraghi

LONDON, Aug 3: Chelsea have finally accepted defeat in their bid to get Italian striker Pierluigi Casiraghi back to full fitness, reports AFP.

The 31-year-old played just 10 games for the Blues before suffering a horrific knee injury which has seen him undergo 10 operations.

Stamford Bridge chairman Ken Bates told the Daily Star newspaper here on Thursday: "Casiraghi won't be playing any more."

"We have been paid 4.05million (6.075million dollars) insurance, which will mean he can't play top-level football again."

"We gave him 20 months, but he was still walking with a limp, so we had no choice."

Casiraghi's agent Fabio Parisi revealed that the player was served six months notice by Chelsea, who will stop paying his wages this month.

However, he feels that the Blues have acted prematurely in consigning the Italian to the football scrapheap.

"Of course it was a very, very bad injury and there is only a slim chance of him making a comeback," said Parisi. "But we consider it is still too early to say he will not."

"It looks strange Chelsea should collect the money without Gig's consent."

"We have appealed to the Premier League about this because his contract requires that an independent medical report is completed and that's not been done."

"We asked for a copy of the insurer's report but didn't receive one and have passed on the problem to lawyers in London."

"We are waiting to see what the FA board or the civil court will decide."

Chelsea are also reported to have turned down two big-money offers for Norwegian striker Tore Andre Flo, believed to have been from Real Madrid and Barcelona.

Flo's agent Gunnar Martin Kjenner said: "I can confirm
