Indian cops nab another bookie

NEW DELHI, Aug 5: New Delhi police have arrested a third bookmaker linked to a cricket match-fixing scandal involving disgraced South African ex-captain Hansie Cronje, a crime branch source told AFP.

The official said police arrested Sunil Dara, alias Bittoo, from New Delhi's main bus terminus late Friday.

"He was trying to flee from the city. We earlier raided his house," the official said.

The New Delhi police placed charges against four South Africans — Hansie Cronje, Hershelle Gibbs, Nicky Boje and Pieter Strydom — on April 7.

Two bookmakers, Rajesh Kalra and former Hindi film actor Kishan Kumar, were arrested by police earlier. They are currently on bail.

Another suspect linked to the scandal, London-based Indian Sanjiv Chawla, has not been arrested as yet.

Pete, Patrick depart

TORONTO, Aug 5: There isn't going to be a rematch of this year's Wimbledon final between Pete Sampras and Patrick Rafter at the 2.95 million dollars Tennis Masters Series-Canada, reports AP.

Eighth-seeded Marat Safin of Russia outlasted Sampras 6-4, 3-6, 7-6(8) Friday.

"It's a tough loss," Sampras said. "I feel like I played well enough to win. But it wasn't meant to be."

The loss came after an ailing Rafter fell apart after winning the first set in a 3-6, 7-6(1), 6-2 quarterfinal loss to Jiri Novak of the Czech Republic.

Bayern, MU meet again

MUNICH, Aug 5: Bayern Munich will finally get the chance to gain revenge on Manchester United for their defeat in the 1998/99 Champions League final when they play Saturday evening in the Opel pre-season tournament, reports AFP.

The invitation event is being staged as part of celebrations to commemorate the German club's centenary.

Bayern easily beat UEFA Cup holders Galatasaray Istanbul 3-1 in the opening game Friday afternoon after goals by Roque Santa Cruz, Samuel Kuffour and Alexander Zickler. Romanian star Gheorghe Hagi pulled one back for the Turks two minutes from time.

In the second game, Manchester United won their way into the final with a 1-0 win over reigning European champions Real Madrid who only sent out a second string line up. Manchester's Norwegian super-sub Ole Gunnar Solskjaer scored the winner in extra time.

Kluivert makes a Real vow

BARCELONA, Aug 5: Barcelona's Dutch international forward Patrick Kluivert says he would never follow in Luis Figo's footsteps and sign for Real Madrid, reports Reuters.

"I would never go to Real because I know how much damage it would do to the Barca fans," the player said in an interview with Barcelona-based daily Sport today.

"There are times when money is secondary and feelings are more important."

Kluivert said that Figo's departure had come as a surprise to the team.

"We didn't expect it to happen. His attitude has hurt the rest of us, although we have to respect his decision."

Shearer battles to be fit

LONDON, Aug 5: Newcastle striker Alan Shearer will have just one chance to prove his fitness for the club's curtain-raiser at Manchester United after being ruled out of Saturday's friendly in Holland, reports AP.

The 29-year-old former England skipper was not included in the 17-man party which flew to Rotterdam on Friday after struggling to shake off a bout of tendonitis in his knee.

Stewart sparkles

Openers doing well for WI

MANCHESTER, England, Aug 5: West Indies were 35 without loss at tea in their second innings on the third day of the third Test here at Old Trafford on Saturday, reports AFP.

Sherwin Campbell was 21 not out and Adrian Griffith 12 not out, the tourists 111 runs behind England's first innings 303.

Griffith prodded Andy Caddick dangerously close to Vaughan at short leg in the second over, but West Indies moved into double figures without any further problems.

Campbell progressed with a risky boundary which flew off the edge but wide of Graham Thorpe at third slip.

Off-spinner Robert Croft thought he had Griffith caught at short point by Dominic Cork but New Zealand umpire Doug Cowie correctly ruled that the ball had touched the pad and nothing else.

Earlier Michael Vaughan had stage-managed an England fightback after Friday's heroes Alec Stewart and Marcus Trescothick fell in the first 32 balls of the day.

There was no run feast for another big crowd after Stewart departed to Curtis Ambrose off the day's second delivery without adding to the magical 105 of his 100th Test.

Trescothick advanced by only a single to 66 when he was bowled off his front pad by Courtney Walsh, but Yorkshire's Vaughan battled it out through almost the whole of the morning session to be 23 not out in England's 253 for seven at lunch, a handy lead of 96.

West Indies were looking a shade spirited when Stewart and Trescothick were stroking the ball round Old Trafford last night, but they emerged with fresh light — and Ambrose and Walsh refreshed.

The ball moved around and apart from Stewart's departure in something of an anti-climax, and Trescothick's dismissal, England lost Craig White and later Dominic Cork to the new ball.

Vaughan joined the action when Stewart touched a catch to wicketkeeper Ridley Jacobs. He saw White howled by a beauty from Reon King which nipped back and Cork was taken behind off Ambrose. Cork had added a useful 41 with Vaughan.

The boundaries — there were only two in the session — were hard to come by so Vaughan and Cork engaged in some brisk running between the wickets to keep the scoreboard moving.

Ambrose ticked another one off his list, claiming Caddick lbw at 283, but there was some defiance from last man Darren Gough, who clubbed Walsh over cover for three.

Kumble stars for Leics

LONDON, Aug 5: Anil Kumble rubbished his poor form with the bat at Canterbury with a half-century as Leicestershire added 51 more runs to their 324 for eight against Kent in Division One of the County Championship on Friday, reports AFP.

The Indian wrist-spinner then snared three victims in his more familiar role with the ball as Kent, struggling to avoid the follow-on, slumped to 184 for eight in reply.

Elsewhere two former England Test fast bowlers produced career-best performances.

At The Oval, Division One leaders Surrey surged towards victory over Lancashire.

The county champions were grateful for Alex Tudor's best-ever return of seven for 48 as third-placed Lancashire were shot for a paltry 120.

Meanwhile another England discard, Hampshire's Alan Mullally, claimed four further victims at Derby, following his nine for 93 in Derbyshire's first innings, for a career-high match haul of 13 wickets.

Anna moves into last four

CARLSBAD, California, Aug 5: Anna Kournikova looks like she might finally break through for her first career WTA title.

Kournikova used late service breaks in each of the last two sets for a 2-6, 6-4, 7-5 victory over France's Nathalie Tauziat on Friday in the quarterfinals of the dlr \$35,000 Acura Classic, reports AP.

At The Oval, Surrey captain Adam Holoake elected to bat again rather than enforce the follow-on and his decision was justified as Mark Butcher's 95 and a half-century from Nadeem Shahid batted Lancashire out of the match.

Holoake was able to declare on 227 for four — a lead of 417 — providing spin twins Saqlain Mushtaq and Ian Salisbury enough time to weave their magic on the final day.

Lancashire reached stumps at 19 without loss knowing they will need all their resilience to keep their unbeaten championship record intact and in so doing remain apace in the race for the title.

Hampshire's survival hopes were upped by left-arm Mully's devastating display against their relegation rivals.

The 31-year-old produced the remarkable figures of 14-6-14-4 as Derbyshire closed on 66 for four, still 18 runs in arrears.

Earlier Derek Kenway struck 136 and Dimitri Mascarenhas exactly 100 for his maiden first-class century, the pair adding 187 for the sixth wicket, as Hampshire manoeuvred from 141 for five overnight to a hefty 394 all-out.

Second-placed Yorkshire posted 327, a 32-run deficit on Somerset's first innings at Taunton — Anthony McGrath (74), Darren Lehmann (56) and Ian Fisher's career-best unbeaten 68 helping to provide three batting points.

Any chances of a full points quota were scuppered, however, when captain David Byas had to retire hurt on two after tearing cartilage in his knee.

With Byas at a local hospital, Somerset extended their lead by a further 33 without mishap by the close.

LONDON, Aug 5 (AFP) — There's only one Thierry Henry -- and that is manager Arsene Wenger's major concern as he prepares the Gunners for their latest bid to challenge not only the supremacy of Manchester United in the Premiership but also the rest of the giants in Europe.

Wenger bought his fellow Frenchman from Juventus last summer to replace outgoing compatriot Nicolas Anelka. He was convinced he could convert Henry from a lefty winger with an unreliable scoring touch into a penetrating central striker.

But what Wenger could hardly have imagined was that the youngster he once groomed towards World Cup stardom at AS Monaco would also become a lethal marksman in the mould of former Highbury hero Ian Wright, Arsenal's all-time record goal-scorer.

Henry, despite a stuttering start to his first campaign in England, finished with 26 goals in just 37 starts and between mid-March and early May he had a phenomenal run of 10 consecutive appearances in which he scored at least once in every game.

LONDON, Aug 5: Middlebrough boss Bryan Robson has reacted furiously to claims that he had to make a U-turn.

Alan Boksic the highest-paid player in Britain to hire him to the north-east of England, reports AFP.

Middlebrough will apply for a work permit for the 30-year-old Croatian striker after agreeing a 2.5-million-pound (£3.75-million-dollar) move from Italian Serie A side Lazio on a three-year contract.

But Robson blasted reports that Boksic will be paid 63,000 pounds (£94,500 dollars) a week at the Riverside Stadium -- 11,000 thousand pounds (16,500 dollars) more than Manchester United skipper Roy Keane.

"Why is it that every time we sign a top-class player, people have to find an edge to it?" he said. "They have to find some reason for why he would want to come to Middlebrough almost to justify it."

SA WONT APPEAL

ZURICH, Aug 5: The South African Football Federation (SAFF) have dropped their bid for arbitration over last month's controversial FIFA vote to hold the 2006 World Cup in Germany, a source here revealed Friday.

"South Africa have accepted the vote. It is established that we will no longer question the vote," the source said.

South Africa lodged their appeal after FIFA's executive voted 12-11 on July 6 to make Germany the venue rather than South Africa after New Zealand delegate Charlie Dempsey withheld his Oceania vote.

YEOBAH WEARY OF TAX EVASION TRAIL

FRANKFURT, Aug 5: Ghanaian striker Tony Yeboah, has a few days respite from his tax evasion trial here and has flown back to Hamburg to prepare for next week's Champions League qualifier against Brondby Copenhagen.

The 34-year-old striker was grilled in court Thursday about one million Marks (470,000 dollars) he allegedly failed to pay in income tax when he was with Eintracht Frankfurt in 1993.

BLANC PREPARES TO SIGN OFF

PARIS, Aug 5: France's legendary defender Laurent Blanc will leave the international stage on August 16 as he plays his last game for "Les Bleus" in a friendly match against a Rest of the World team in his hometown of Marseille, reports AFP.

In an interview with French sports daily L'Equipe, Blanc outlined his sentiments going into the match: "It will be a nice

little game amongst friends. A great evening because it will be the first time the French team have been together since Euro 2000.

"I can't wait for these two days just to see the boys, train together, joke around and of course play the match," said the Inter Milan defender.

"When I announced my international retirement, it was mentioned that I would play with the world team but it was then decided by the French Federation that the European champions would play the match so there you have it," he added.

Redondo doubtful

CARNAGO, Aug 5: AC Milan's latest high-priced acquisition, Argentina's Fernando Redondo, injured his thigh Friday and may miss the team's Champions League match next week, reports AP.

Redondo, who came over from Real Madrid earlier this week, suffered a right thigh strain in a morning practice session and will miss Saturday's game against the Swiss squad Morbio.

Doctors will determine in the coming days if he will be ready for Milan's Champions League qualifier against Dinamo Zagreb on Wednesday.
