

Venus' third in a row

CARLSBAD, California, Aug 7: Wimbledon winner Venus Williams captured her third consecutive title and stretched her win streak to 15 matches by defeating Monica Seles here Sunday in the finals of the WTA Acura Classic, reports AFP.

Third seed Williams won the match-up of United States Olympic teammates 6-0, 6-7, 6-3, taking the \$7,000-dollar top prize and her 12th career title at this \$35,000-dollar US Open hardcourt tune-up.

The year's final Grand Slam tournament begins August 28 in New York. Williams has set herself up as a favourite to dethrone her sister Serena at Flushing Meadows, saying it's possible that no one can beat her.

Bayern, Bayer look good already



COLOGNE, Germany, Aug 7: Both Bayer Leverkusen and Bayern Munich underscored their excellent pre-season form with impressive wins over the weekend and will enter the new Bundesliga season, starting Friday, as firm title favourites, reports AFP.

Leverkusen beat Spain's Mallorca 4-0, while Bayern Munich defeated Manchester United 3-1 in the final of their Masters 2000 centenary tournament.

"Bayern and Bayer are looking pretty darn good. Both want to challenge for the title, no doubt about it," new German coach Rudi Voller said after putting both teams under the microscope as he readies to announce his debut team Tuesday for an August 16 friendly against Spain.

"In the second half I saw a few players who were really fighting for a firm place in the first eleven, that makes me feel positive," Leverkusen coach Christoph Daum added.

"We won't let ourselves be distracted by the good result though. There is no room for dreaming before our Bundesliga opener against VfL Wolfsburg," he said.

Many other Bundesliga clubs however are still looking for form after a bad weekend. A defensive oriented Hertha Berlin held off AS Roma for a 0-0 draw in their Olympic stadium in front of 15,000 fans.

Roma were missing star Argentine striker Gabriel Batistuta while Hertha sorely missed German international Stefan Beinlich in the midfield.

Kaiserslautern were beaten 3-1 by Second Division FC Nuremberg, while 1860 Munich lost 2-3 to Spanish club Real Oviedo, 1860 play the first leg of their Champions League qualifying tie against English Premiership outfit Leeds United on Tuesday.

The Bundesliga's three new teams all registered losses in their last warm-up games. Bochum were defeated 0-2 by Second Division neighbours Duisburg, FC Cologne lost 1-2 to Spanish club Real Sociedad San

Hamburg, who play Broudy Copenhagen Wednesday in the first leg of a Champions League qualifier - beat Second Division Arminia Bielefeld 2-0 despite sending out many reserve players.

Hassan twins switch Cairo clubs

JOHANNESBURG, Aug 7: Egyptian stars Ibrahim and Hossam Hassan have moved from Al-Ahly to fierce Cairo rivals Zamalek in a 300,000-dollar deal, it was reported Sunday, reports AFP.

The twins have made more than 100 international appearances each for the Pharaohs and the transfers followed repeated clashes with Al-Ahly's German coach Reiner Zobel.

Striker Hossam, joint leading scorer with seven goals when Egypt won the 1998 African Nations Cup in Burkina Faso, recently spent six months on loan to Al-Ain in the United Arab Emirates.

After failing to sign for a Turkish Second Division club, the brothers agreed to help Zamalek, who are desperate for a change of fortune as Al-Ahly have won the national championship for seven consecutive seasons.

But the Hassans will not be eligible to play in the African Cup Winners Cup quarter-final against Ndiambour of Senegal as player registration closed last month.

Rivalry between the Cairo clubs is so intense that Zamalek fans demonstrated when news broke that Hossam and defender Ibrahim might be moving across the Nile.

Apart from lengthy spells with Al-Ahly, the twins played for PAOK Salonika in Greece and Neuchatel Xamax in Switzerland, where Hossam scored four goals in a 1990 UEFA Cup drubbing of Scottish side Celtic.

Boje breaks through



COLOMBO, Aug 7: Left-arm spinner Nicky Boje gave South Africa the edge over Sri Lanka when he snatched three quick wickets for nine runs off 24 balls on the second day of the third and final cricket Test Monday, reports AFP.

Boje's brilliant bowling at the Sinhalese Sports Club ground here saw Sri Lanka slump from 122 for one to 138 for 4 by the close in reply to South Africa's 279.

Boje ended the century partnership between Sanath Jayasuriya and Russel Arnold and then went on to take two further wickets to finish the day with figures of three for 21 off ten overs.

Arnold was superbly caught by Lance Klusener at mid-on for 28 as he tried to loft Boje over the top.

Boje followed it up by having Aravinda de Silva stumped by Mark Boucher for two by a ball that turned sharply to beat the bat and then got the prize wicket of Jayasuriya, who top edged a sweep to backward square leg for Gary Kirsten to pick up a simple catch.

Jayasuriya had batted fluently for his 85 off 113 balls hitting 14 fours, and his loss could be costly for Sri Lanka, hoping to gain a first innings lead over South Africa.

Before Boje came on the scene, Sri Lanka lost opener Marvan Atapattu for 10 when Nantle Hayward bowled him off his pads.

South Africa were greatly indebted once again to the batting talents of Klusener who stuck it out for 246 minutes to make a top score of 95 not out.

Klusener who hit an unbeaten 117 in the Kandy Test, was on course for his second successive century but ran out of partners.

The big hitting left-hander struck only six fours in his disciplined knock which carried

South Africa from a hopeless 117 for 6 to their final total of 279.

Boje (21) helped Klusener add 54 for the eighth wicket, and Paul Adams (15) frustrated the Sri Lankan bowling further with a further stand that realised 38 runs for the ninth wicket.

Chaminda Vaas dismissed Boje to finish with four wickets for 85 runs. Adams was trapped low by Muralitharan who ended with three for 70.

Sri Lanka and South Africa are tied at one win each in the three-match series.

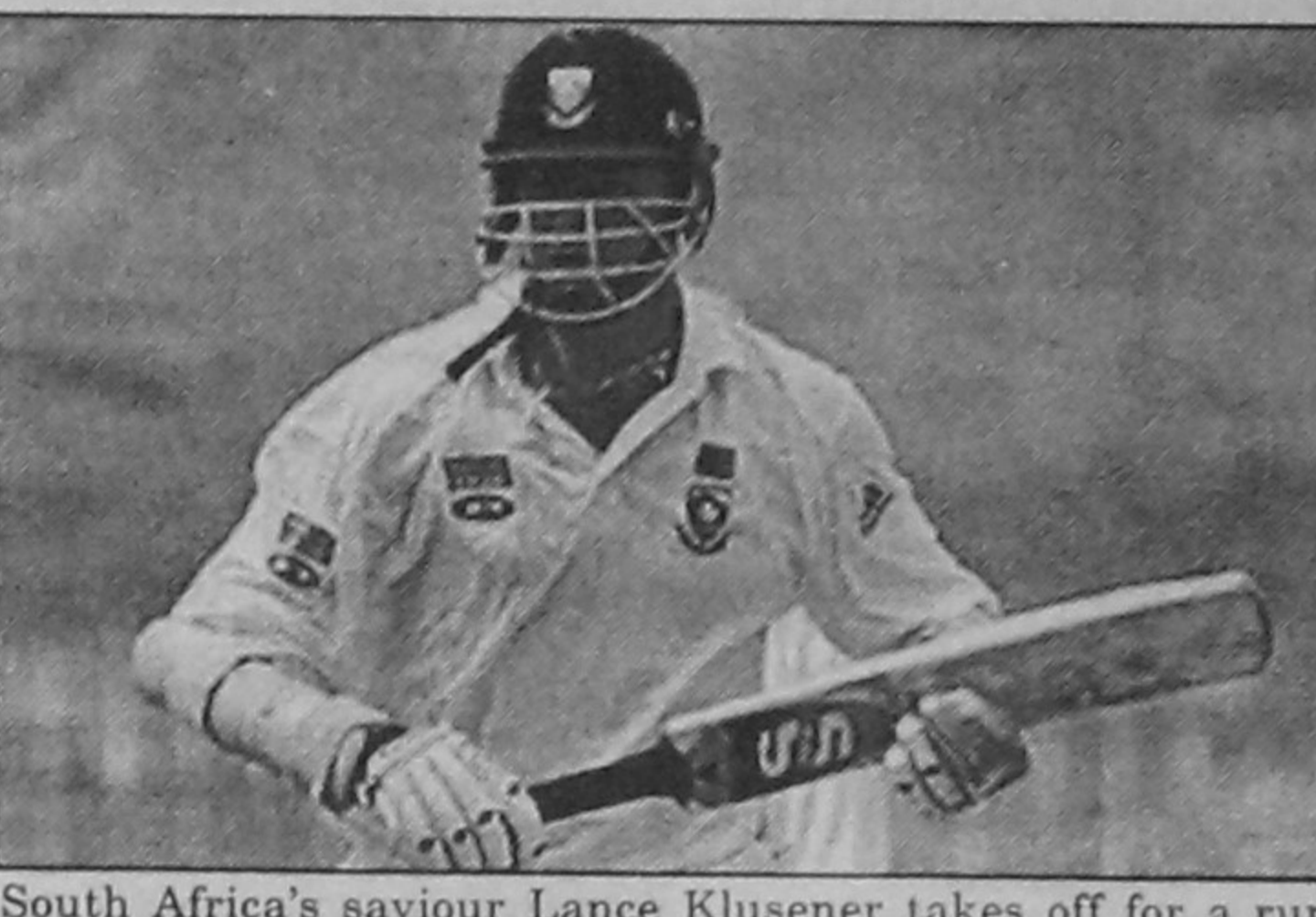

Safin master of Toronto

TORONTO, Aug 7: Russian Marat Safin cruised to a 6-2, 6-3 victory over qualifier Haral Levy of Israel to win the Masters Series in Toronto yesterday and collect his third title of the year, reports Reuters.

Marat, who won in Barcelona and Mallorca in the spring, clinched his first win in a Masters Series tournament, earning 400,000 dollars and lifting him from eighth to fourth in the Champions Race.

Tyson to fight in Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 7: Controversial former world heavyweight boxing champion Mike Tyson is to fight in Malaysia, Bernama news agency said Sunday, reports AFP.

It quoted local sponsor Promote Classic Sdn Bhd as saying the fight would take place next January 20 but his opponent would be known only in November.

Kuala Lumpur had hosted a top world heavyweight clash when Muhammad Ali met Joe Bugner in 1975. Ali will be in the ring next January to introduce Tyson and his opponent at the 100,000-capacity National Stadium, Bernama said.

Rose Chu, chief executive officer of Promote Classic, said Tyson and his opponent would be in Kuala Lumpur two weeks before the bout for charity events and promotional activities.

Big boys' first hurdle of the season

PARIS, Aug 7: The season could effectively be over before it has even begun for some of the big names in European football this week.

For such is the importance of making it into the lucrative European Champions League for last year's runners-up Valencia and the two Milan clubs, as well as the likes of Anderlecht, Glasgow Rangers and Leeds United, that failure would have disastrous consequences.

Glasgow Rangers, whose stranglehold on the Scottish title has made the Premier League a one-horse race for all but one year in the past decade, will not relish their trip to Herfolge in Denmark, while Leeds need to build a reasonable cushion against Munich 1860 for the return leg in Germany.

Galatasaray, the rising stars of European football after their UEFA Cup win and Turkish title last year, should not find Swiss side St Gallen too much of an obstacle to their ambitions, while the draw is likely to figure a number of great names from the past.

Among them should be Feyenoord, who ought to prove too strong for Austrian outfit Sturm Graz; Panathinaikos of Greece, provided their defence can hold out in the first leg away to Polonia in Warsaw and Valencia who should not find Tyrol Innsbruck too much of a threat.

But the pick of the crop of this week's matches are, those which are most difficult to call - Anderlecht against FC Porto and Dynamo Kiev versus Red Star Belgrade.

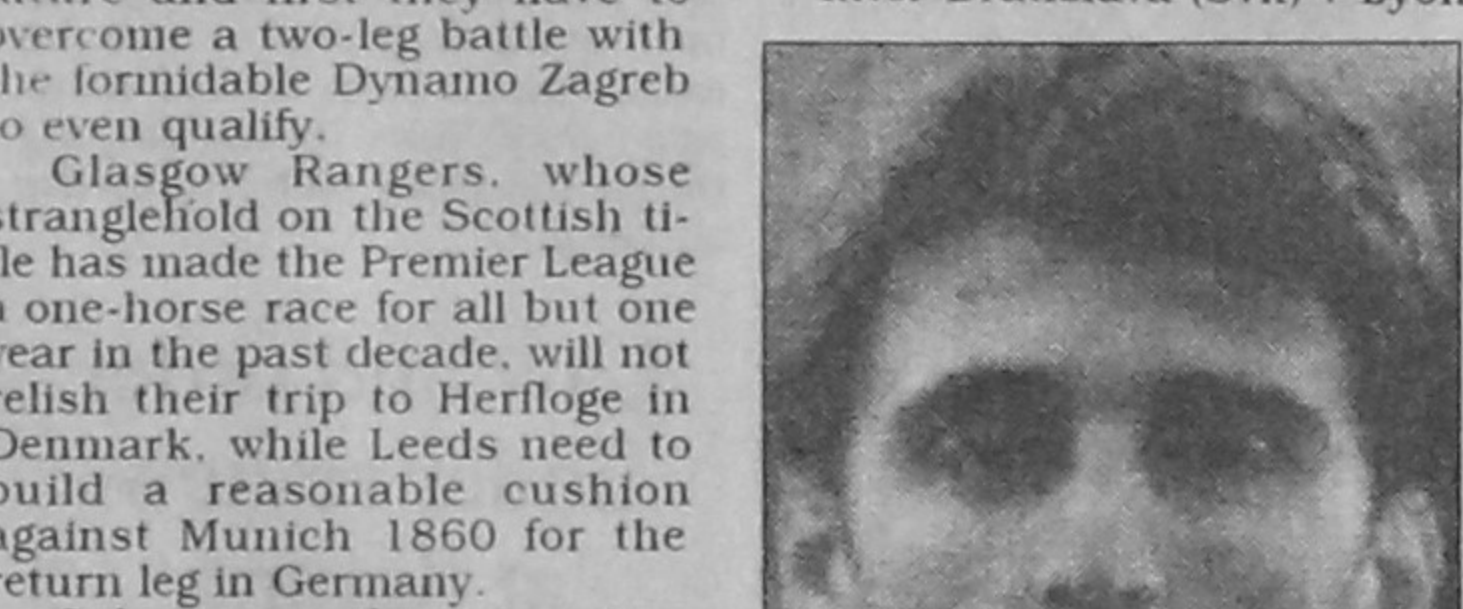

GLASGOW, Scotland, Aug 7: Robert Tomashek's late, late show allowed Hearts to claw their way back for a 2-2 draw at St Johnstone on Sunday night, reports AFP.

Tomashek's effort on the stroke of full time, added to a Kris O'Neil strike, was enough to cancel out Saints' goals, scored by Keigan Parker and Graeme Jones.

But the signs look ominous for Jim Jeffries' men heading into Thursday's UEFA Cup clash with Icelandic IFV.

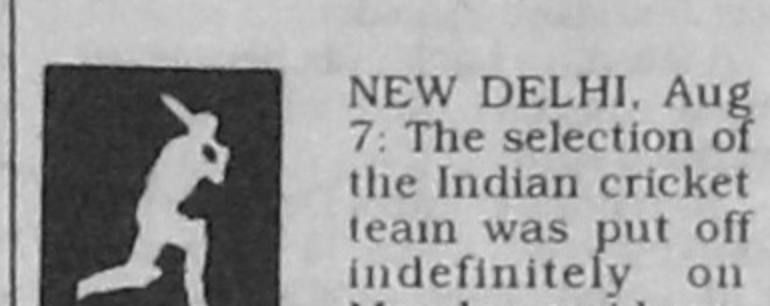
The St Johnstone breakthrough came in the 31st minute when Jim Weir looked to have squeezed in Saints' opener at the near post from a John Paul McBride corner but the goal was credited to young striker Parker.

St Johnstone doubled their lead in the 73rd minute when Tommy Lovenkrands sent a cross to Jones, who fired past keeper Antti Niemi from five yards after a blunder by Steven Pressley.

Hearts pulled a goal back seven minutes from time when Mohammed Sylla got in the way of Alan Maitland allowing O'Neil to clip the keeper's shoulder and bounce over the line.

O'Neil turned provider in the last minute of the game when he flicked on to Tomashek, who grabbed Hearts' second to snatch a point.

Sahara Cup at risk?



NEW DELHI, Aug 7: The selection of the Indian cricket team was put off indefinitely on Monday amid speculation the government would cancel next month's Sahara Cup series against Pakistan because of recent massacres in the disputed territory of Kashmir, reports AFP.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) said selectors had been ordered not to meet on Thursday to pick the squad for the annual five-match series in Toronto, Canada from September 9-16.

"The meeting will not be held on Thursday as decided earlier," BCCI officials told the Press Trust of India. "It will be held once we get government clearance."

A BCCI source had earlier told AFP: "There is no point in going ahead with the selection unless we are certain the tournament will take place."

Indian Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee last week

blamed the Pakistan-backed Lashker-e-Taiba rebel group for a series of massacres which claimed nearly 100 lives in Kashmir.

Islamabad's military regime has denied any involvement in the killings.

The massacres could hit both the annual series and India's first Test tour of Pakistan in 11 years, planned for later this year.

Sports Minister Sushay Dhindsa said the government was still undecided whether to clear the team's participation in the Sahara Cup.

"We have to review the situation keeping in mind the recent killings in Jammu and Kashmir by militants and see whether such a tour would be in the national interest," the minister said.

"When the file regarding the Indian cricket team's visit to Toronto comes to me, I will have to see whether it would be in the national interest that India plays against Pakistan at this juncture."

The Indian government refused to play against Pakistan in last year's Sahara Cup series in Toronto, in the wake of the two-month Kargil conflict between Indian troops and Pakistan-backed forces.

The Kashmir situation apart, the government will also consider the continuing fallout from cricket's match-fixing scandal before giving the go-ahead for the tournament.

Sports Minister Dhindsa has said that players being investigated, such as coach Kapil Dev, former captain Mohammad Azharuddin and Ajay Jadhava, should be kept out till their names are cleared.

But BCCI president A.C. Muthalik differed with the minister, saying he did not want to penalise players unless they were found guilty.

The two arms of government inquiring into the case, the Central Bureau of Investigation and the income-tax department, have indicated it could take months before their findings are made public.

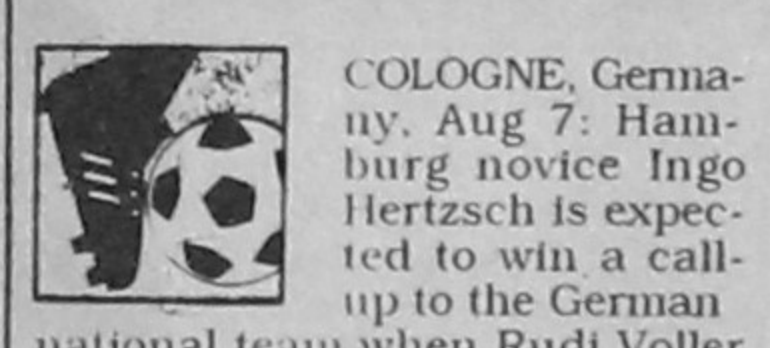
Team doctor Marcello Manzuoli said the 23-year-old striker had suffered possible ruptured ligaments and would undergo an MRI scan on Monday.

If the injury is as serious as suspected, the Brazilian will have to undergo surgery and could be out of action for up to six months.

The player, previously with Brazilian side Portuguesa dos Desportos, is reported to have signed a deal worth 20 billion lire (9.7 million dollars) with the Italian side for this season.

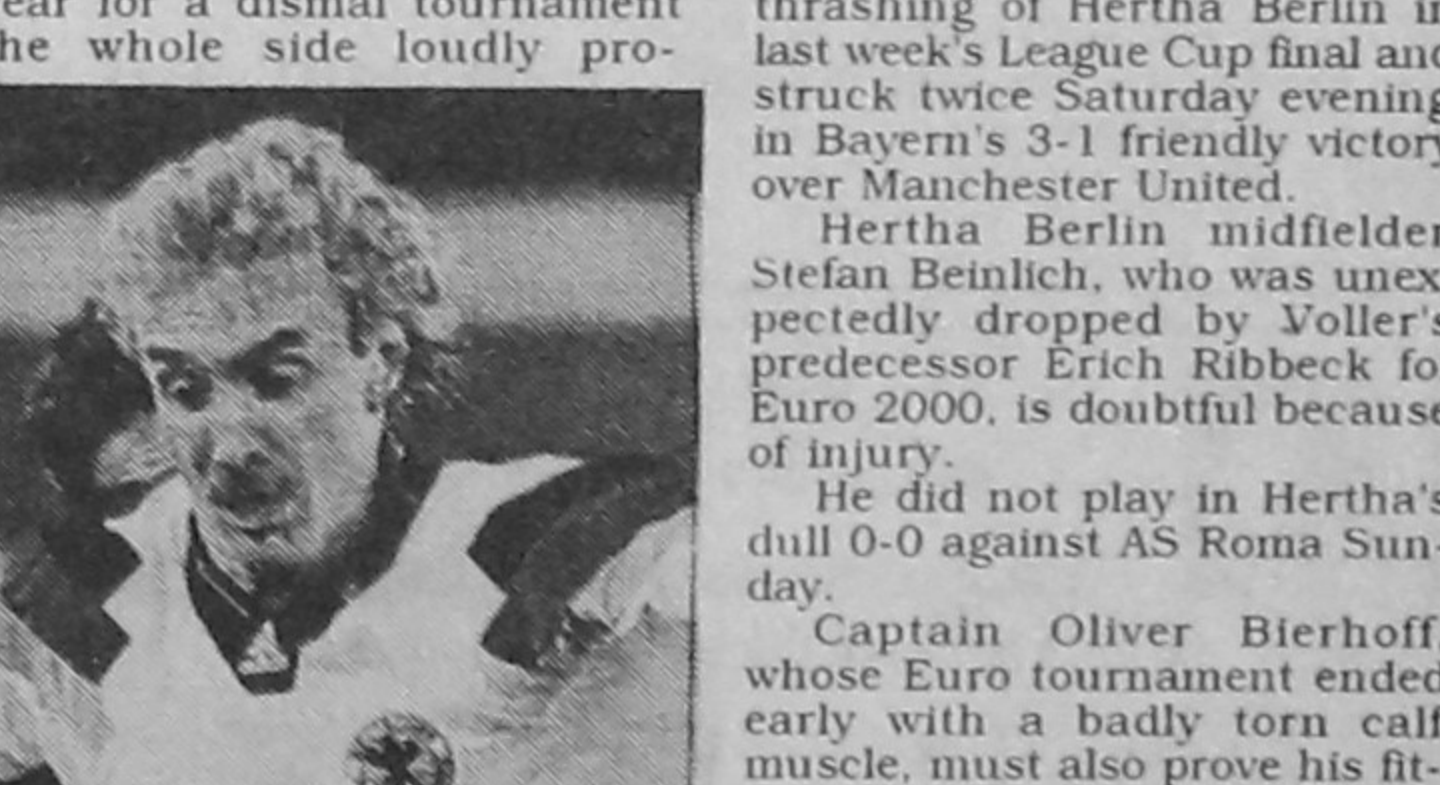
