BCU procession and rally tomorrow

Bangladesh Chhatra Union (BCU) yesterday blamed police and the ruling party for repression on them throughout the country and demanded immediate release of all its arrested workers at Khulna and withdrawal of 'false cases' filed against them.

The left leaning student organisations also announced a series of agitation programme to press home its four-point demand.

The programmes, disclosed at a press conference at Madin's canteen on the Dhaka University campus, includes procession and rally in Dhaka tomorrow, rallies throughout the country and laying of siege to the DIG office at Khulna on August 16, submission of memorandum to the Home Ministry and to the Deputy Commissioners in all the districts on August 17 and a students' rally at Khulna on August 18.

BCU demands include arrest of Litu, Hirak and Kabir gang-killers of journalist Shamsur Rahman, recover of illegal arms removal of SP of Khulna and OC of Dumuria thana, immediate release of its 10 arrested leaders including Shamim and withdrawal of 'false case' lodged against 21 of its leaders.

Prof Firoza Begum's death condoled
