LONDON, Aug 21: Yorkshire bowlers Matthew Hoggard and Chris Silverwood starred as the visitors coasted to an eight-wicket win over Leicestershire on Sunday, boosting the Tykes' hopes of winning National League Division One, reports AFP.

Yorkshire took just two and a half hours for their emphatic victory, Hoggard setting a new career best for the second match in succession, taking five for 28. He was backed up by Silverwood's four for 11.

Trevor Ward and Darren Maddy top-scored with eight apiece as Leicestershire fell for 53 runs.

Henman itching for US Open
INDIANAPOLIS, Indiana, Aug 21: Britain's Tim Henman expects to be hitting the practise courts in New York as early as Wednesday to prepare for a confidence-filled assault on the US Open, reports AFP.

The Briton was far from depressed after a semifinal loss to Russian Marat Safin at the 800,000-dollar RCA Championships. Though his name let him down on the night, the 25-year-old Briton was actually inspired by how well he has performed in recent weeks.

The Indianapolis semi followed a final showing of the week previous in Cincinnati where he lost to Sweden's Thomas Enqvist.

"I've played a lot of matches these weeks and this is the best I've played during a stretch," said Henman. "It's definitely the best I've ever played in the States."

Henman's efforts will keep him solidly within the leading 10 men in the season-long points race on the ATP Tour where Brazil's Gustavo Kuerten will stay in command for an eighth week this year.

MONTREAL, Aug 21: Serena Williams retired in the third set of her championship match against world number one Martina Hingis here Sunday with a left foot injury, casting doubts on her ability to defend her US Open title, reports AFP.

Swiss teen Hingis won the 1.08 million-dollar Canadian Open title. She was leading 0-6, 6-3, 3-0 when the fourth-seeded American dropped out, ending her family's WTA win streak at four titles.

Hingis won her 31st career singles title and fifth of the season - first on hard courts - and a first prize of 166,000 dollars by defending her crown. She improved to 53-8 this year, 30-5 on hard courts, and stopped a three-match losing streak to Williams.

Champions sail in opener

LONDON, Aug 21: Manchester United began their defence of the English Premiership crown with a comfortable 2-0 win over Newcastle at Old Trafford on Sunday, reports AFP.

Norwegian international Ronny Johnsen broke the deadlock after 21 minutes when his header flashed past keeper Shay Given.

Ryan Giggs almost doubled the score just before half-time but his rasping volley came back off the post.

Given made a string of excellent saves to keep United from running riot but Andy Cole put the result beyond doubt 20 minutes from time.

The former Newcastle star exchanged passes with Giggs in the penalty area before slipping the ball under the helpless keeper.

Dwight Yorke was left on the bench after returning from international duty with Trinidad and Tobago, so Teddy Sheringham partnered Cole up front.

Skippier Roy Keane shook off an ankle injury and was able to start although Denis Irwin was not so fortunate and was replaced by Phil Neville.

Newcastle handed debuts to summer signings Carl Cort and Argentinian Daniel Cordone but England international Kieron Dyer was named among the substitutes.

Newcastle, who started with Nikos Dabizas, Marcelino and Alain Goma in defence, were the more enterprising in the early stages.

Jaap Stam blocked an Alan Shearer shot on three minutes and French international goalkeeper Fabien Barthez saved from Cordone moments later.

Newcastle went close on 15 minutes after Shearer squared the ball for Rob Lee but his 25-yard effort was well saved by Barthez.

The champions soon settled into their stride and Given pulled off a superb one-handed save to keep Stam's header out on 19 minutes.

But the Republic of Ireland international was unable to repeat the feat from the resulting corner when he could only push Johnsen's effort into the net.

United were rampant and Welsh wing wizard Giggs saw his stinging volley come back off the post after a slick move

between Keane and Paul Scholes. Keane was only inches off target two minutes before the break after he exchanged passes with the lively Cole and then rifled a 25-yard drive just past Given's right post.

After a scrappy start to the second period the game burst into life again on 54 minutes when Cole got the better of Marcelino on the left and headed in-field fly with a blistering drive which Given tipped away magnificently.

Despite the pressure from the home side, Newcastle could have levelled the scores after 68 minutes. Second half substitute Dyer found Cordone on the edge of the area who turned smartly before curling in a low shot which Barthez did well to keep out.

United took their foot off the pedal in the last quarter but enjoyed plenty of possession while Newcastle were left chasing shadows.
