Earlier in April this year, the fate of 132 HSC candidates under the humanities group of the institution looked uncertain as Dhaka Board authorities announced that they would not be allowed to sit for the exams due to fault in their registrations. The students took to the streets, drawing a huge media attention and the college authorities were compelled to shut the college for about two months.

Finally, the High Court in its judgement on August 21 upon a writ petition filed by the aggrieved students, declared valid the registrations of 132 girl students, allowing them to sit for the examinations under provisional order of the court.

The court also cleared the way for publication of their results. The board authorities were preparing to move the Supreme Court, but refrained by the Prime Minister.
