

"I hope that I have passed on as much as I can about fast bowling to the youngsters so it is now up to them." Many international teams

have had great fast bowling pairs: Harold Larwood and Bill Voce for England. Ray Lindwall and Keith Miller for Australia. Wes Hall and Charlie Griffith (West Indies). Dennis Lillee and Jeff Thomson (Australia) and Waqar Younis and Wasim Akram (Pakistan).

Then came the four-pronged attacks starting with Dennis Lillee, Jeff Thomson, Gary Gilmour and Max Walker of Australia followed by the great West Indies' quartets.
