At Baker's suggestion, they threw a couple of tracks to Braxton: "Give U My Heart," a duet with Babyface, hit No. 29 on Billboard, while "Love Shoulda Brought You Home"—which also appeared on her debut album—hit No. 33. It was a fortuitous start.

Braxton's self-titled debut, meanwhile, sold more than seven million copies and earned her three Grammy Awards, three American Music Awards, and two Soul Train Music Awards. There were five hits from the album, all of which earned gold records. Babyface also used Braxton for the song "Let It Flow" on the award-winning soundtrack for the film Waiting To Exhale.

Her second album, Secrets, took eighteen months to produce and featured a somewhat flashier Braxton; her song "You're Makin' Me High" won a 1996 Billboard Award for Best R&B Single. She also became more involved in creating her music, serving as co-executive producer and co-writing four of the album's songs. Secrets has turned into another multi-million-seller, and Braxton opened 1996 on the road with saxophonist Kenny G, who plays on the Secrets track "How Can An Angel Break My Heart." She cleaned up again at the 1997 Grammy Awards, winning Best Pop Female Vocal Performance for "Un-Break My Heart" and Best Female R&B Vocal Performance for "You're Makin' Me High."

Besides music, Braxton is often asked about an acting career. She surely has the looks for it: People magazine listed her as one of the most beautiful women in the world. Braxton says acting is a consideration—she gets plenty of scripts, mostly for romantic comedies—but the woman who wasn't allowed to see Walt Disney films when she was growing up says she'd rather direct and produce.

The only real challenge in the game is finding keys and solving the puzzles, the keys are especially hard to spot, as they are very small, and tend to blend with the floor.

The controls of the game are pretty good, once you have found them! Yeah, the game doesn't include a controller layout file, and you don't even find it in the options section!!

It took me twenty minutes to figure out that F4 opens up your inventory and if you press L once the game starts taking screenshots once in every second!

Graphics and level design: (it's a little hard to feel scared unless you have BMB AGP!)

If the game doesn't scare you, its hardware requirements will. Unless you have at least a 8MB AGP card, the graphics will appear murky, and displaced. Once you've got past this obstacle, the rest of the game is really cool. The game is about a haunted mansion, in Hollywood, L.A. and except the first stage, most of the game takes place inside the enormous mansion. The graphics are rich with textures, and are very detailed and interactive. The broken down, cobweb filled mansion looks great, and the strange lighting makes the whole game come alive.

Pros: Innovative storyline and cut scenes make the game feel like a movie, cool graphics.

Cons: No controller layout, stupid AI, keys are hard to spot.

Graphics Tips

Want to make a rough metal effect for your logo or any other design in Photoshop? Try this one:
Take a new blank file (say, 6 inches wide and 2 inches high). Type an alphabet (say, I). Colour it with gradient fill tool using gray to light blue (or whatever metal shade you want to use). Now apply the Noise filter using the monochromatic option to the strength of around 90. Now using the Image->Scale command, stretch the image as wide as you can do. What you now see is a real noisy image. Copy it to the clipboard (control C).
Open your desired logo/image file where you'd be applying this noisy image by using Paste Into command from edit menu. Select the logo/desired image area. Now use the Paste Into command. After pasting the noisy image inside your target image, stretch or reduce the noisy image as you desire. Apply the Paste Into Image permanently by using the command from the Layer menu. Keeping the logo selected, you may now use airbrush tool to darken the edges using the multiply mode with black or dark blue (or the darkest shade you chose for the metal surface).
