

Country's food supply, stock situation satisfactory: WFP

The current food supply and stock situation in Bangladesh is one of the best in the country's history, according to WFP evaluation, reports UNB.

But,

in the UN agency's view, ensuring access of the poor to food remained "a continuing challenge."

Dr Werner Kiene, representative of the World Food Programme in Bangladesh, disclosed the assessment in a meeting with President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed yesterday.

He made the farewell call on the President at Bangabhaban when he presented a report to the president highlighting background history of food aid to Bangladesh.

They discussed the food security and the food assistance by WFP for the people of Bangladesh, particularly in the context of improving household food security for the 30-million undernourished people who live below the poverty line.

He apprised the President of the new country programme for WFP food assistance to Bangladesh for 2001-2005. Dr Kiene said the new country pro-

gramme would channel food resources worth 200 million US dollars to Bangladesh over the coming five years.

"WFP's goal is also to help the government prepare for meeting any emergency situation like floods, cyclone and other natural disaster," he said.

The WFP country chief appreciated Bangladesh's "high degree of efficiency" in the implementation of food-assisted programmes.

President Shahabuddin thanked the WFP representative for his keen interest in the process of supplying food to the poor people and also the successful assistance to Vulnerable Group Development (VGD) and Rural Development (RD) activities in the country.


