Country renews pledge to protect ozone layer

Bangladesh yesterday renewed its pledge to protect the crucial ozone layer of the atmosphere as it joined the world in observing the International Ozone Day as part of a global campaign against the use of substances depleting the sphere, reports BSS.

"We in Bangladesh, once again, renew our pledge to protect the ozone layer," said Environment Minister Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury as she opened the main official function of the day at a hotel here joined by experts, donor representatives, officials and professionals.

The minister said under the

provisions of the Environment Conservation (Amendment) Act 2000, no entrepreneurs were being given permission to set units using ozone depleting elements like the CFC gas used in various sectors including air conditions and refrigeration, as raw materials.

But State Minister for Environment HN Ashequr Rahman, who joined the function as the special guest, accused the developed nations for not laying proper attention to the problem despite being the major contributor to the crisis.

UNDP resident representative Jorgen Lissner praised

Bangladesh efforts to combat the ozone depletion and particularly the government policy to enable non-government sectors to work on this field through distribution of donor funds.

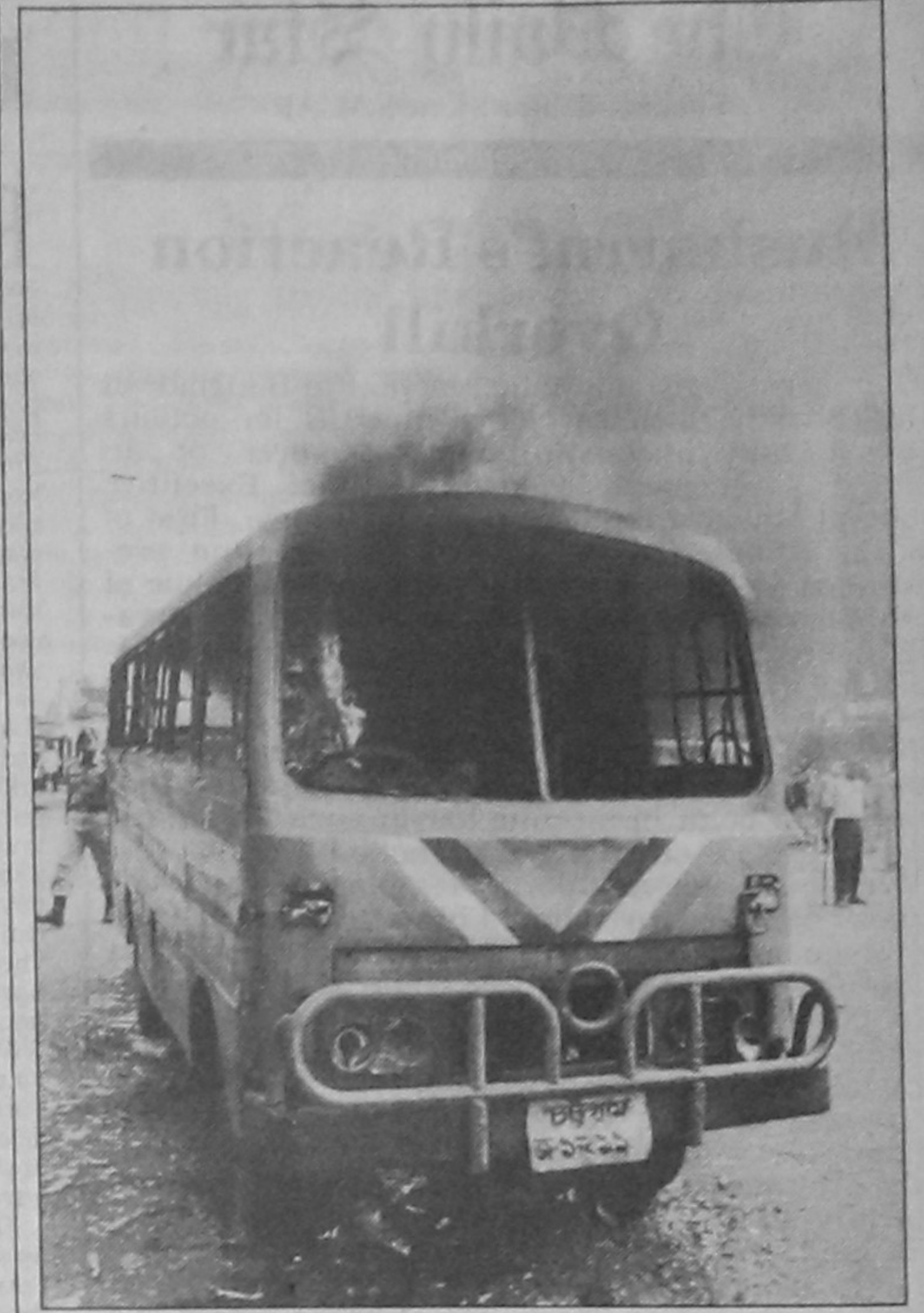
Environment Secretary Mamun-Ur-Rashid chaired the inaugural session of the seminar in line with this year's theme of the day "Save O3 our Sky: Protect Yourself: Protect the Ozone."

Institutional Strengthening for the Phase-out of ODS (Ozone depleting substances) Project of the Environment Department organised the seminar.

Ozone, an allotrope of oxygen, is poisonous pale blue gas having a pungent smell which is continually being formed and destroyed naturally in the stratosphere. The Ozone layer protects the earth from the harmful effects of solar ultra-violet rays.

The United Nations Environment Programme in late 1980s initiated international approaches to protect the ozone layer, which ended up with adoption of the "Vienna Convention" for the Ozone layer protection in 1985 and the "Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete Ozone Layer" in 1987.

Bangladesh has signed the Montreal Protocol and ratified its London and Copenhagen amendments in 1990 and 1992 respectively.

Int'l court for trial of '71 war criminals suggested

The Liberation War Museum yesterday demanded formation of an international court under the aegis of the United Nations in line with the experiences of Rwanda and the Balkan region to try the Pakistani war criminals who committed genocide in Bangladesh in 1971, reports BSS.

In a press release, the museum expressed firm commitment to mould global opinion with all efforts to try the killers of 1971.

"It is more important for the nation to play a united role for implementing international initiatives to try the killers who are responsible for the barbaric massacres", the press release added.

The museum expressed the hope that irrespective of party affiliation, caste and creed the country's young generation, political parties, social organisations should play a significant role to support the demand for trial of the war criminals that was placed by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the UN Millennium Summit recently.

Dhaka College
Rival faction attacks BCL activists: 5 injured

Five activists of ruling party-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) were injured seriously when rivals attacked them at South Hostel of Dhaka College in the early hours of yesterday.

The injured admitted to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) are all students of honours classes of the college.

They were identified as Bappi and Palash of the Department of English, Hiro of Geography, Belal of Chemistry and Imran, a first year student.

Palash, Imran and Hiro are reported to be in critical condition. Palash and Hiro received severe injuries in the head while Imran in his nose and hands.

Witnesses said that a faction of BCL activists led by college unit BCL secretary Firoz Al

Hamid unleashed the attack with the help of some outsiders from Elephant Road area at about 3am on Friday night. Safayet and Rubel, two accused in the Dablu murder case accompanied them, it was learnt.

They first attacked room no-11 of the South Hostel injuring the residents of the room who were asleep with sharp weapons and iron rods. They then rushed to room no 116 and beat up the residents mercilessly.

The attackers ransacked both the rooms and fired a

blank shot to create panic on the campus, residents said. They left the college immediately after the incident.

The attack was a sequel to establishing supremacy in the college and seat politics in the college hostels, it was learnt. Some BCL leaders however claimed that yesterday's attack was over illegal admission of students into the HSC classes at the college.

When contacted, college unit BCL president SR Palash alleged that his secretary Firoz and his accomplices had attacked some students to establish his supremacy at the college. He said that he had informed the matter to BCL leaders and had urged them to take punitive measures against those involved.

College students alleged similar incidences of beating and stabbing are taking place at the college frequently but the authorities have failed to take action against any of mischief mongers.

Principal of Dhaka College Jahanara Begum, when contacted, told The Daily Star that she would take stern action against the troublemakers. "I have already listed names of the attackers and have asked police to take action," he said.

Dharmadipoli said Syem Mosiur Rahman Palash filed a case against 15 persons.

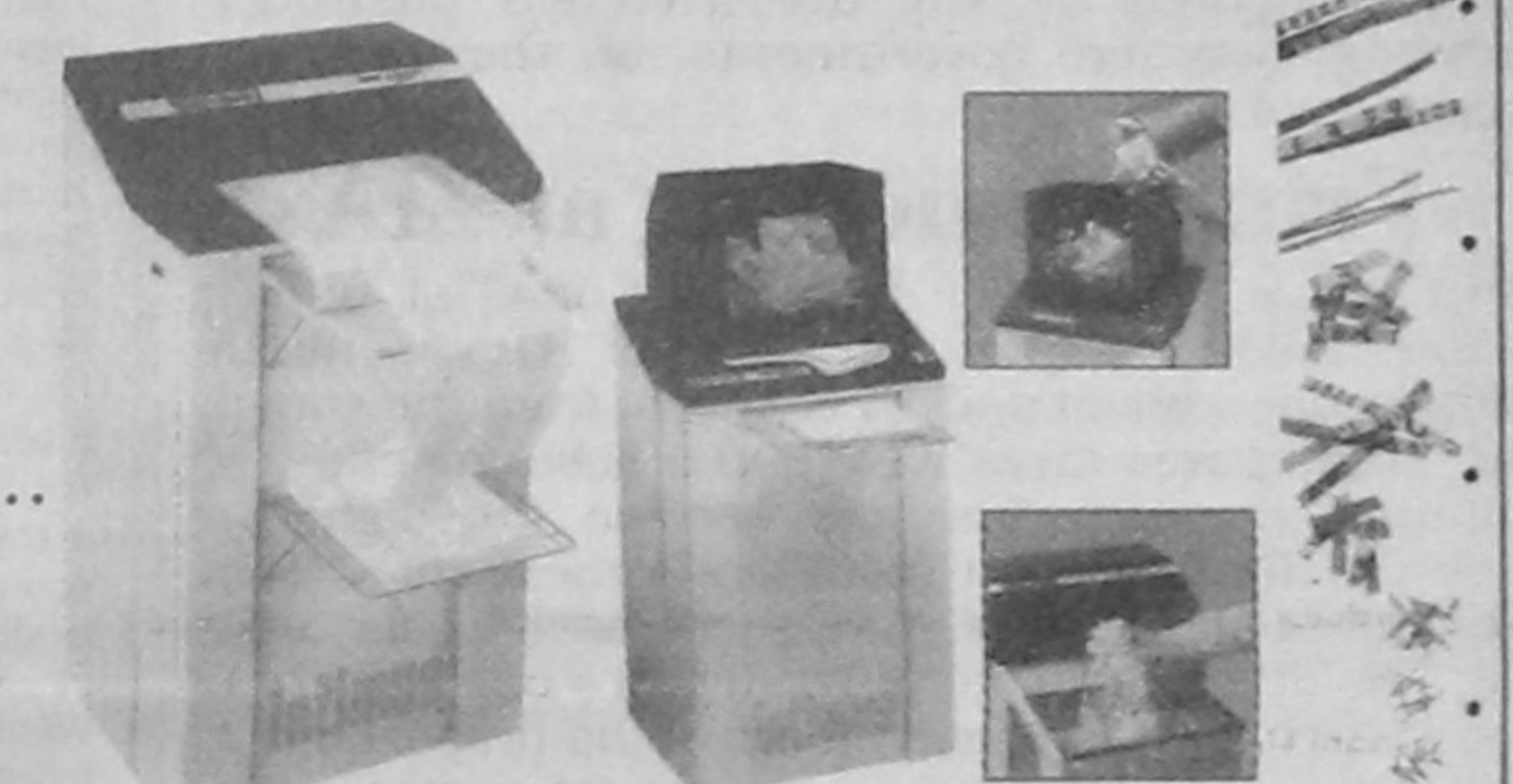

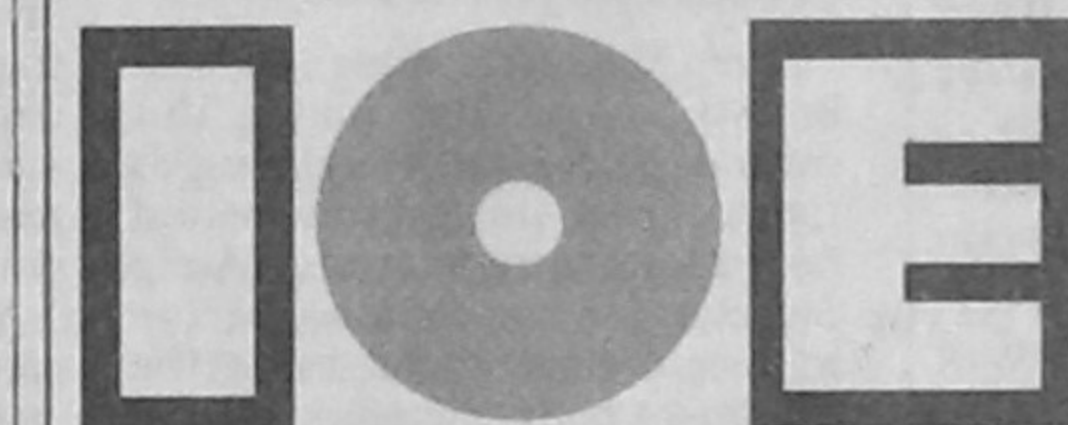
