## Bangladesh to get \$203m aid from UNICEF in 5 yrs

Bangladesh will receive 203 million US dollars from United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) in five years, according to BSS reports from New York yesterday.

The decision was taken at the second regular session of UNICEF Executive Board which began at the United Nations in New York. The Board unanimously approved the amount for Bangladesh Country Programme for 2001-2005.

Dr. Shah Mohammad Farid, Member of Planning Commission, Government of Bangladesh and Chairman of the Joint Government-UNICEF Advisory Group is attending the session as the leader of the Bangladeshi delegation.

Ambassador Anwarul Karim Chowdhury, Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations presided over the session. Bangladesh is the President of the UNICEF Executive Board for the current year.

Dr. Farid told the session that the present government was spending about 40 per cent development fund for social sectors and 15 per cent of Annual Development Programme on education.

While highlighting the significant progress made in recent years in health, education and population sectors, the leader of Bangladesh delegation also informed the session that the infant mortality rate has

been reduced by 30 per cent.

At the same time, he mentioned that maternal mortality rate has fallen from 472 (in 1991) to 440 (in 1997) per 100,000 live births.

The literacy rate has risen from 34.5 per cent to 62 per cent and that population growth rate has come down to 1.6 per cent, he added.

While commending UNICEF strategy in general, Dr. Farid appreciated the role of UNICEF in implementing the programme adopted for supplying safe drinking water in Bangladesh.

He hoped for UNICEF's enhanced role in addressing the problem of arsenic contamination in drinking water. UNICEF was still coordinating the efforts along with government and other development partners, he pointed out.

The leader of Bangladesh delegation informed the session of an important decision of the government to honour mother.

The government had decided that mother's name is also to be mentioned in all official matters, whenever father's name is necessary. This decision has been taken with the support of UNICEF. Dr. Farid stated in his deliberations at the session.

He concluded his remarks by saying "Bangladesh is pledged to a 'Child Friendly Bangladesh' and all our efforts would be made to achieve the same." In this regard he sought all possible support of UNICEF.

RAJSHAHI, Sept 19: Rajshahi University (RU) will begin its admission process for fresh students on October 1.

Prof. Mahbubur Rahman, administrator of the Public Relations department told BSS that the decision was taken at a meeting of the fresher's selection committee this afternoon.

Application forms will be available from October 1 and the last date for submitting the forms is October 19.

Prof. Rahman said the admission tests will be held under the guidance of different departments from November 1 to 15.

The qualifying grades for science students have been fixed at 1100 while it is 1000 for the commerce and humanities group students. ## BCM stages token hunger strike at Shaheed Minar

Bangladesh Chhatra Moity (BCM), a left-leaning student organisation, yesterday staged a token hunger strike at the Central Shaheed Minar demanding ban on the fundamentalist policies of religious fanatics including Jamaat-Shibir and trial of the war criminals of 1971.

The programme was organised to mark the seventh death anniversary of its leader Jubair Chowdhury Rimu. Rimu, leader of Rajshahi University unit of BCM, was killed by the armed cadre of Islami Chhatra Shibir.

A number of students took part at the programme defying rainfall from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Among others, general secretary of Workers Party Rashed Khan Menon, general secretary of Bangladesh Khetmajar Union Saiful Haq and student leaders Ziaul Haq Zia, Alah Minar, Sababbah Ali Khan Kolince, Pronob Gosh Bablu, Jakir Hossain Milan, Akber Khan, Golam Mostofa, Shahidat Hossain Selimuzzaman Mukti, Khokon Das, Tahmidul Haq Mukti, Imam Gazzali, Mostaq Alamgir Raton, Shafiqul Islam and Shamsuzzaman Milan addressed the programme.

The same programme was observed simultaneously in different districts including Khulna, Rajshahi, Chittagong, Barisal, Jessore and Satkhira.




## Workshop on blood donor recruitment
