

WASHINGTON, Oct 13: The United States today ordered embassies in Africa, the Middle East and South Asia to close until next week amid fears of anti-American violence after a suspected terrorist attack in Yemen and continuing clashes between Israel and the Palestinians. Washington's missions in 13 Arab and seven African nations and Pakistan have been told to shut and remain closed to the public until Monday, a State Department official said, reports AFP.

In addition, 35 sailors were injured in the blast, which tore a hole 6 meters to 12 meters in diameter. US officials say suicide bombers blew up their small boat next to the 9,100-ton destroyer.

## 3 murdered, 3 bodies recovered in city

A Jubo League leader, a textile mill executive and an alleged mugger were killed in separate incidents in the city yesterday while bodies of two others including that of a 12-year-old boy were recovered by police.

Another person, fatally injured on Wednesday, died at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital yester-

Jubo League leader Sheikh Jahangir Alam, 40, was shot in the chest when rival gangs led by him and Shaheen traded shots at the 'BNP slum' at Mohammadpur yesterday evening, hospital sources said.

He was rushed to the leaving Radiant Garments, Suharwardi hospital, shifted to DMCH and finally to the Chest Disease Hospital where doctor

The body of the victim was sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy. Jahangir was allegedly involved in a drug racket in the area, sources said.

Dr Gore leaves?

Who will solve if any problem arises with the breathing pacemaker in Shaikat Rahman Amit's body when biomedical engineer Dr Dilys Gore who supervised the surgery leaves?

The company that sold the breathing pacemaker for Tk 41 lakh also sent a device called Trans-Telephonic Monitoring' (TTM) along with it.

Advice regarding Amit's treatment is given from New York through the TTM when any dysfunction is identified. But there is no trained personnel here to handle it, sources said.

Dobelle Institute of USA manufactures the pacer, and it is the only institute in the wold having US FDA approval. Another company in Finland manufactures similar breathing pacer but it does not have any FDA approval.

"We may face small problems with the device, although we have been trained to deal with any technical problem in its functioning," Prof Mohammad Saiful Islam of BSMMUH told The Daily Star yesterday.

Prof Islam said, 'We are not confident about certain things which are not within our knowledge and we will require help. TTM's help will be needed then. Dobelle Institute has a
