Cronje could challenge ban

BLOEMFONTEIN. South Africa. Oct 17 (AFP/DPA): Lawyers for Hausie Cronje. South Africa's disgraced former cricket captain, said Monday they may sue the country's United Cricket Board (UCB) following his life ban.

The lawyers have given the UCB till 4:00 pm (1400 GMT) on Tuesday to withdraw its resolution to ban the sportsman from cricket for life or face possible legal action.

Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) took the decision in an emergency meeting last

The meeting announced the formation of a four-member committee headed by the BOA chief, to fix a fresh date for the Games within the two weeks.
