





WELLINGTON, Oct 21 (Internet report): Former New Zealand captain Ken Rutherford believes the Black Caps have been short-changed by the South African cricket board.

The visitors, led by Naimur Rahman, conceded a 7-wicket defeat in the first one-day match at Blomfontein on Wednesday.

Bangladesh are scheduled to play their third and final onedayer against the host side, led by Dale Benkenstein, at Durban on Monday.

The Test babes had earlier suffered an 82-run defeat in their lone first class match at the hands of Griqualand West.


